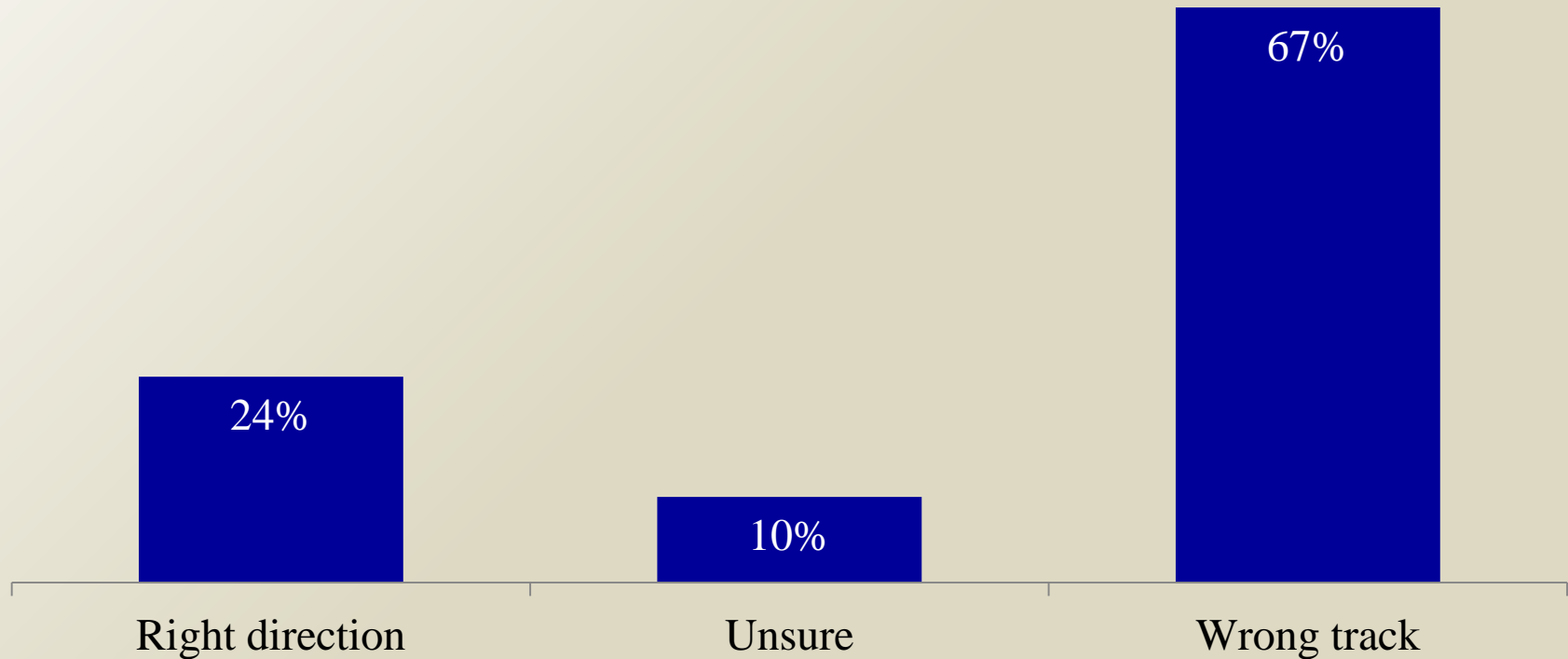

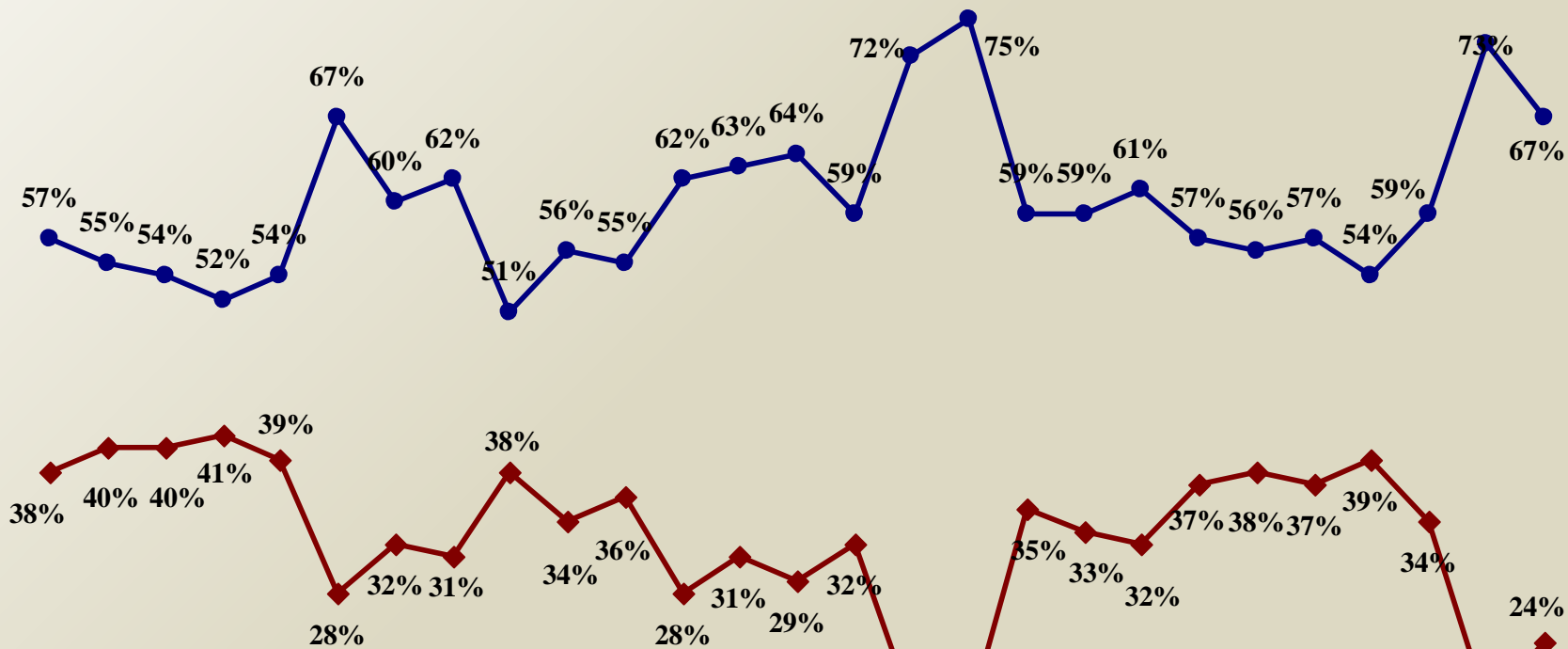
A national survey of 1,000 Registered “Likely” Voters



Do you feel things in the country are going in the right direction, or do you feel things have gotten off on the wrong track?

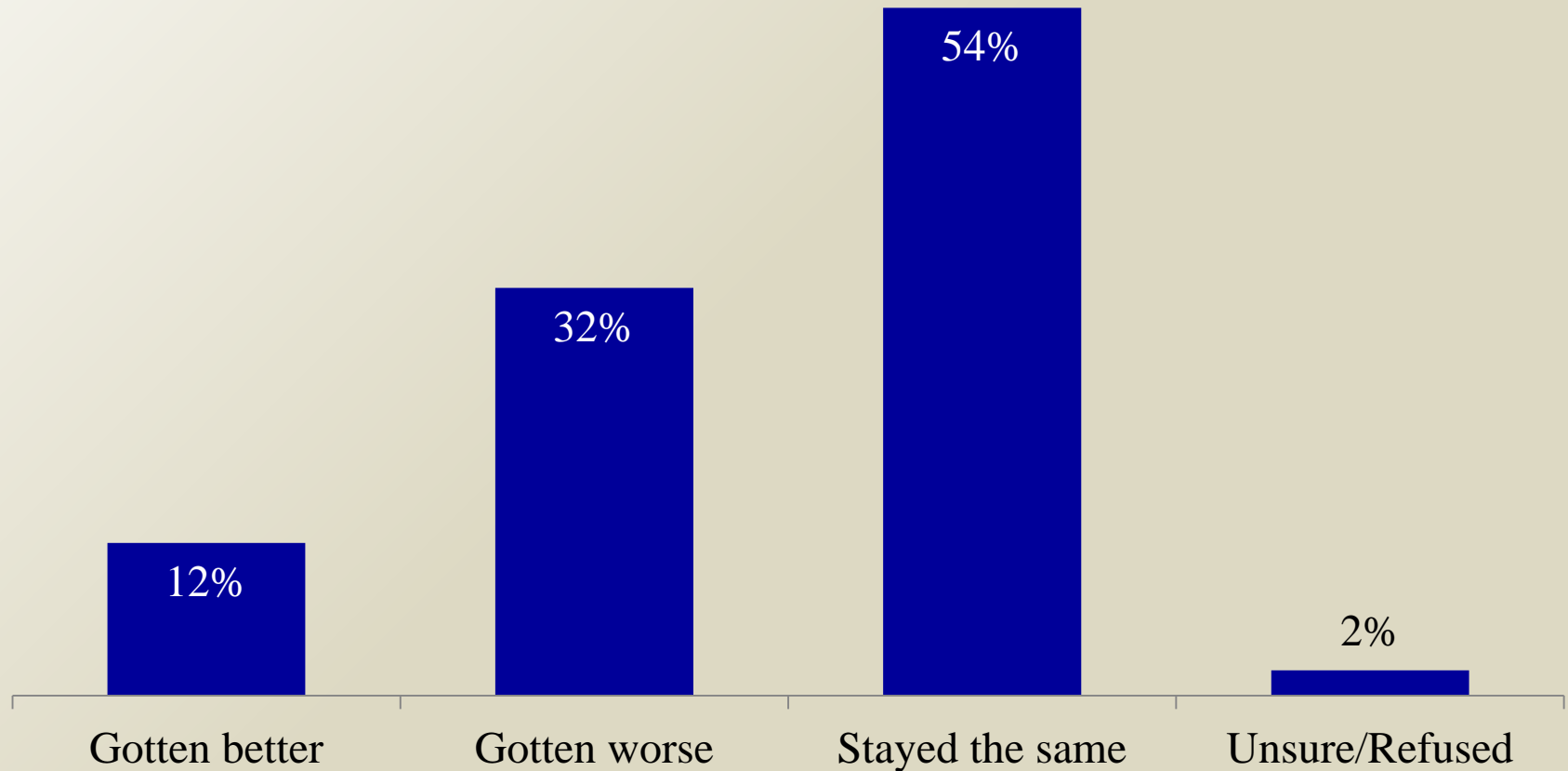

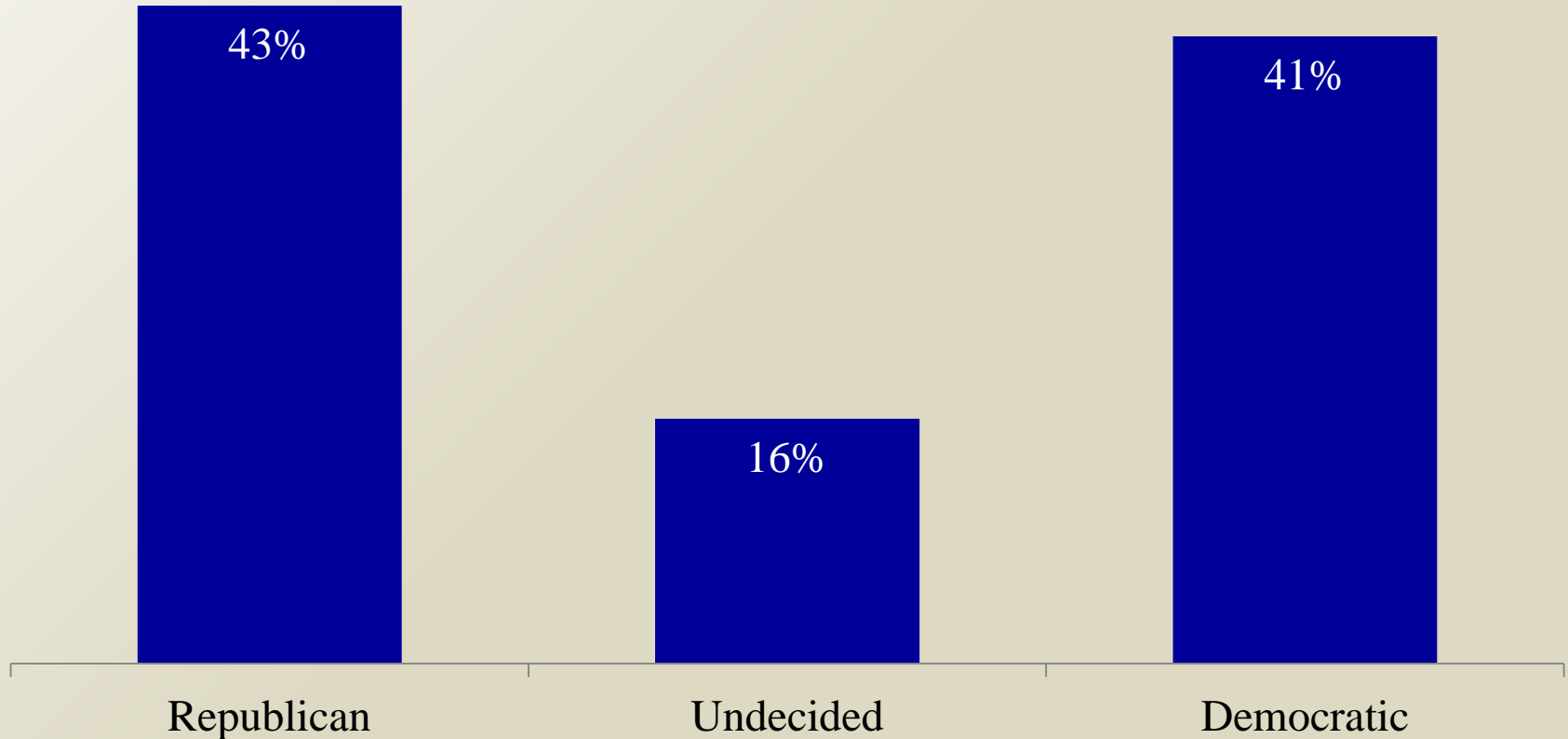

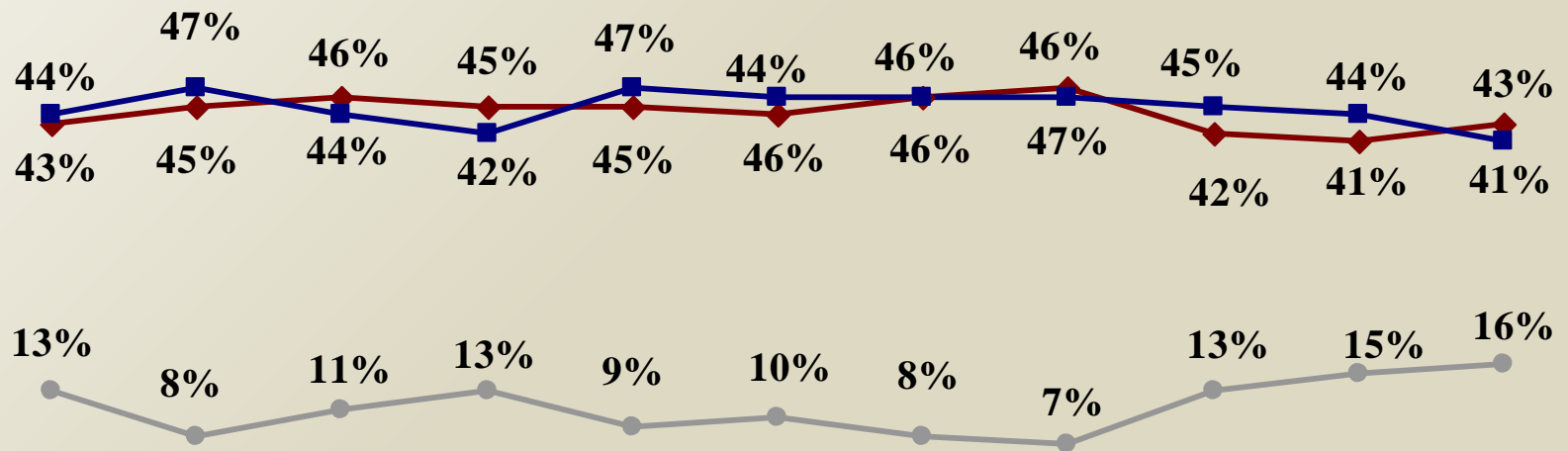
In thinking about the past few months and leaders in Washington solving problems, do you think that things have gotten better, gotten worse, stayed the same over the past few months?



If the election for Congress were being held today, and you had to make a choice, would you be voting for the Republican candidate or the Democratic candidate, in your Congressional district?

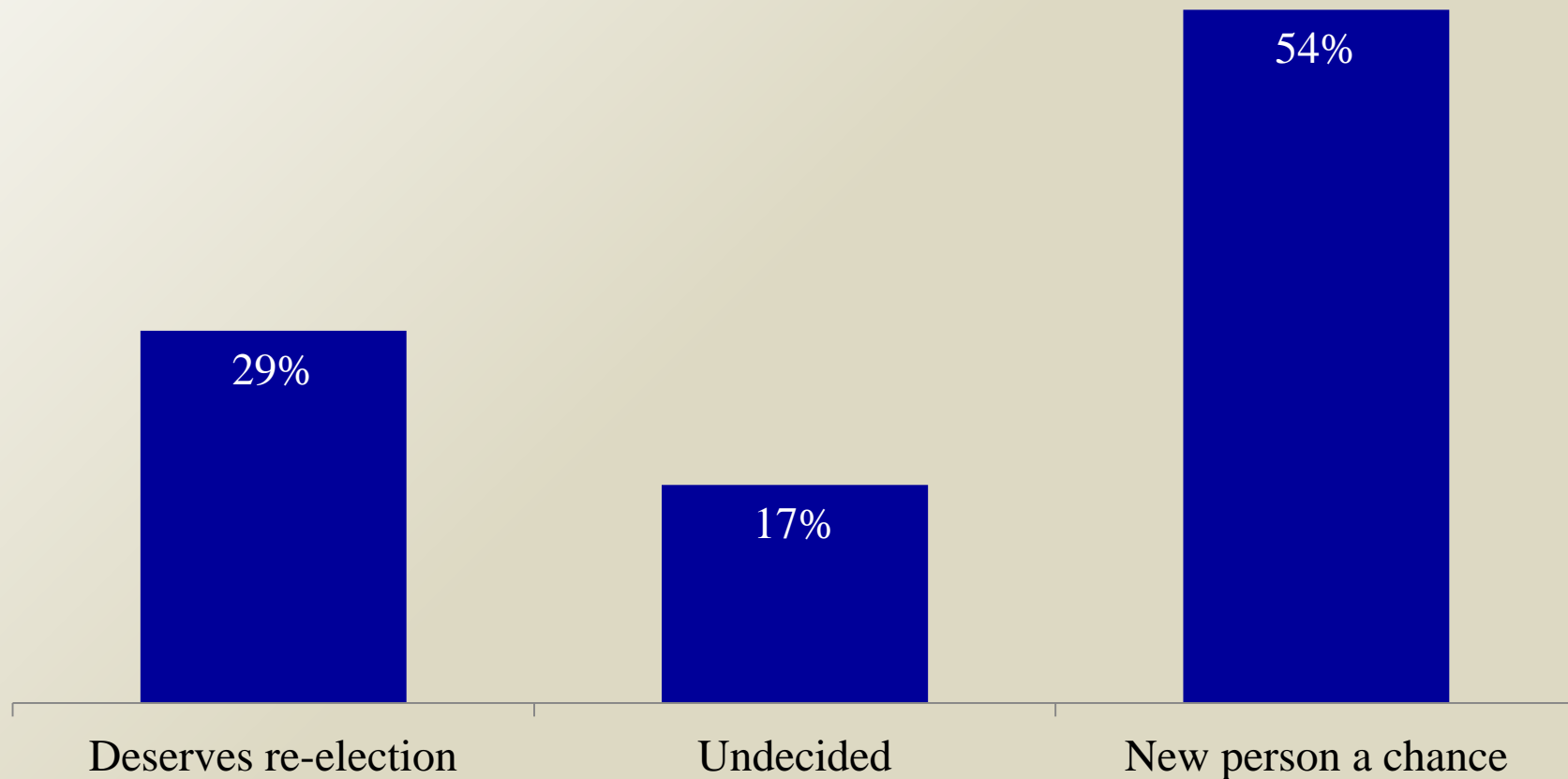


If the election for Congress were being held today, and you had to make a choice, would you be voting for, the Republican candidate or the Democratic candidate, in your Congressional district?

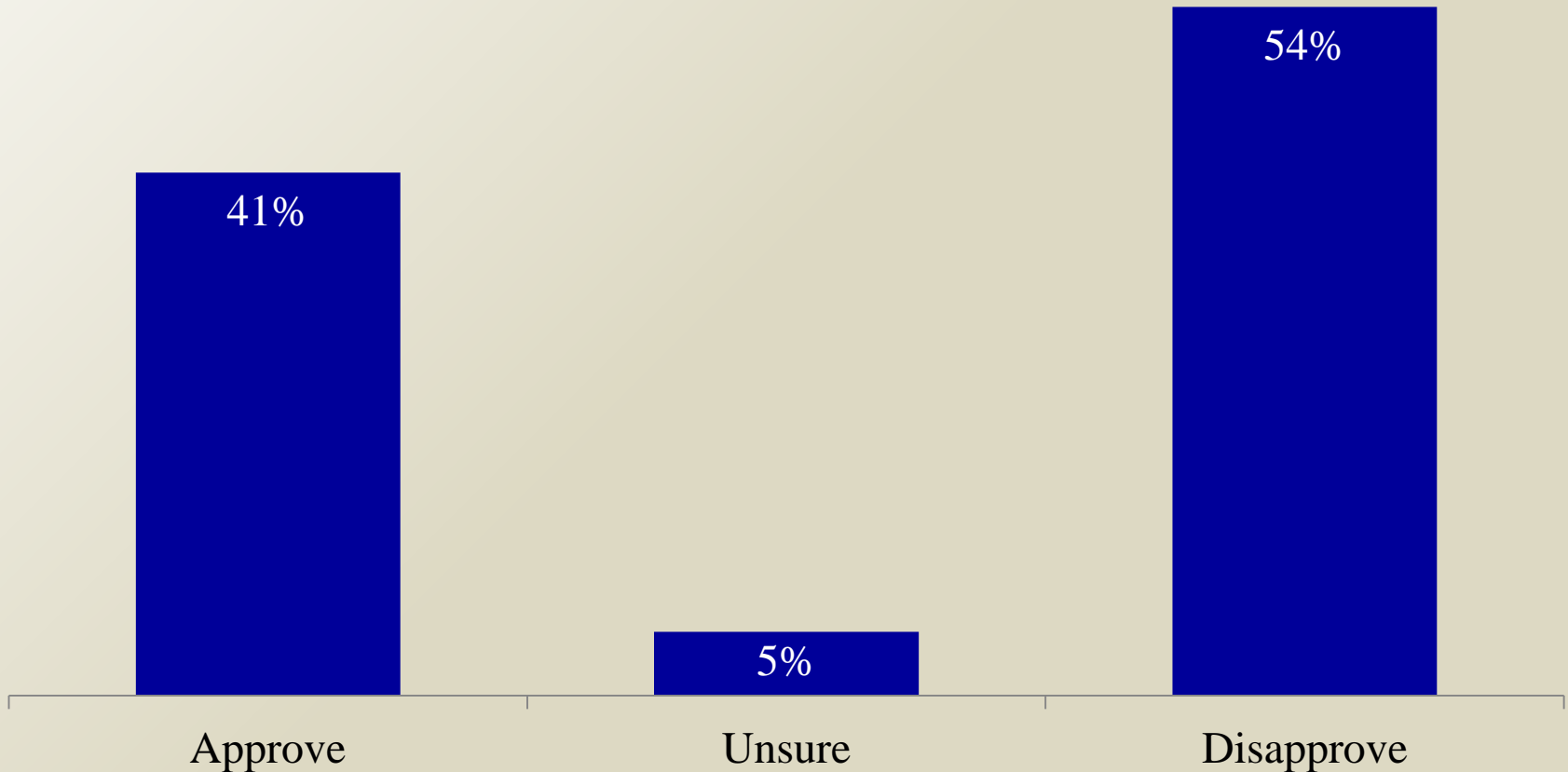

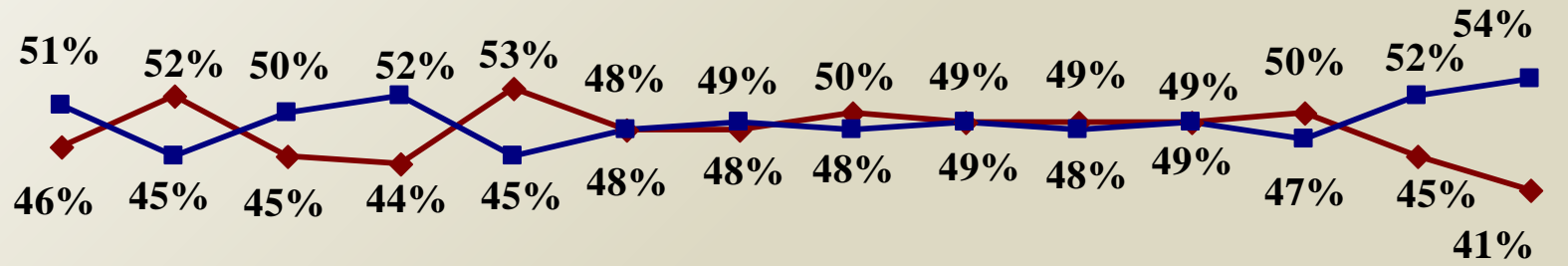


How would you rate the job Barack Obama has been doing as President? Do you approve or disapprove of the job he is doing?



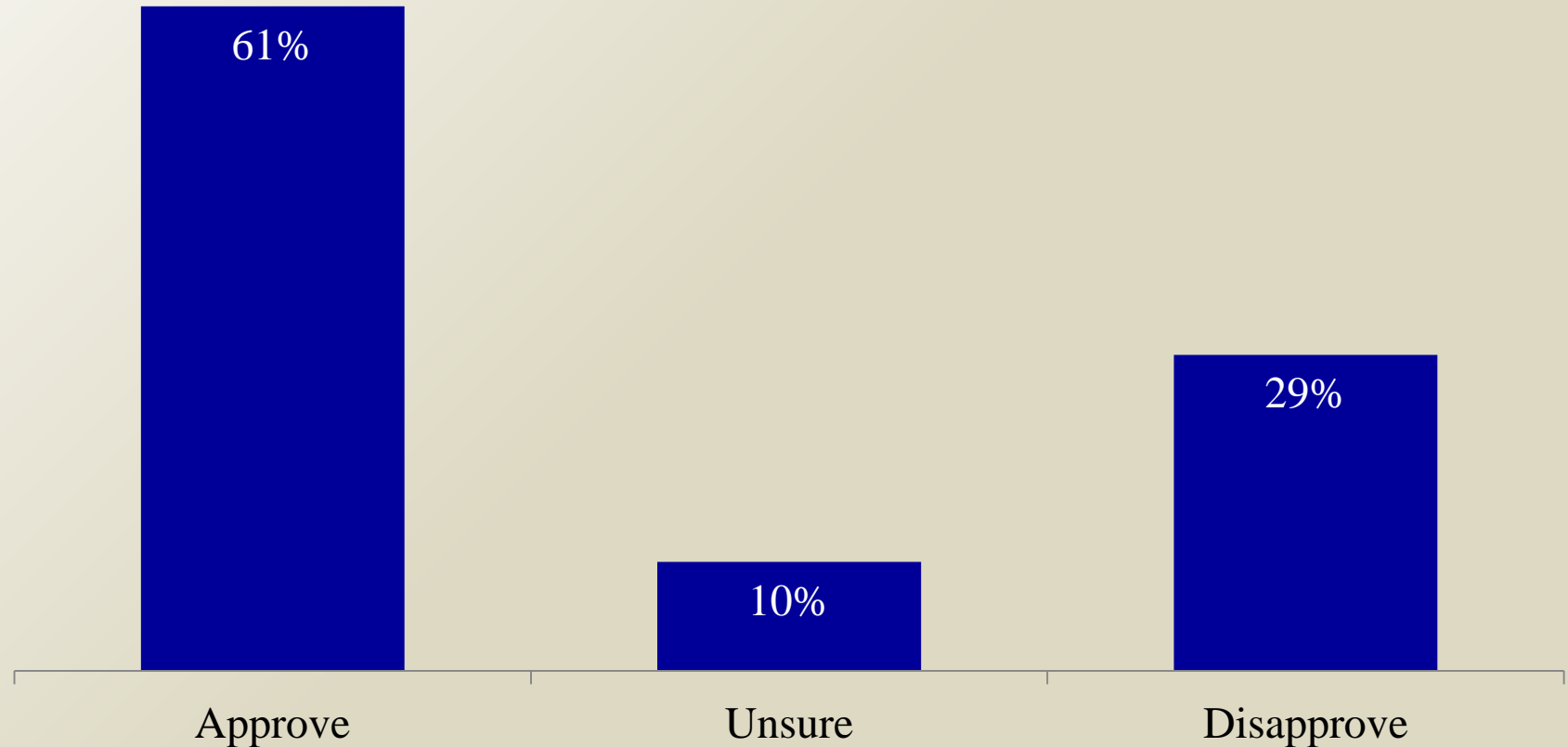

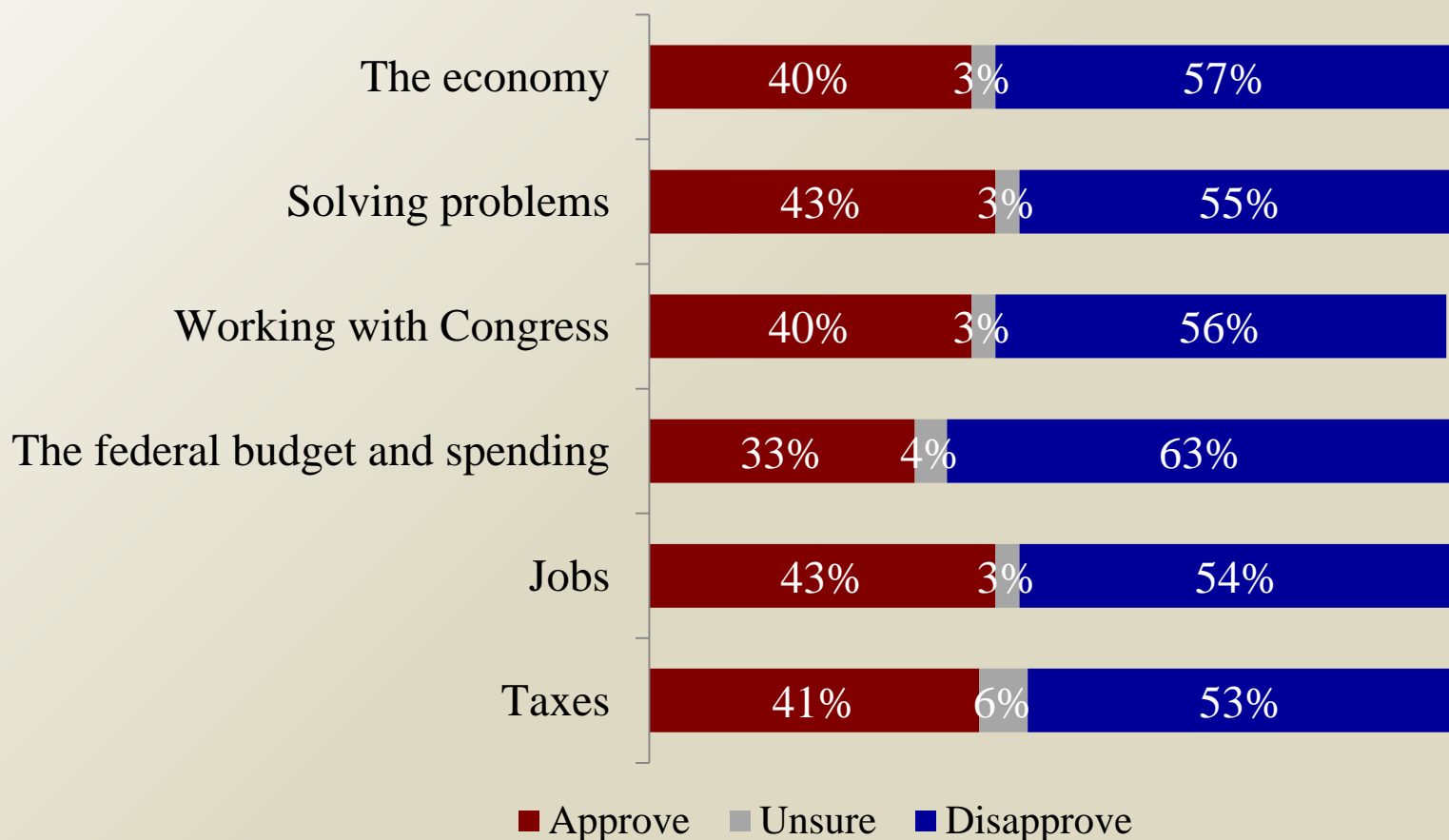

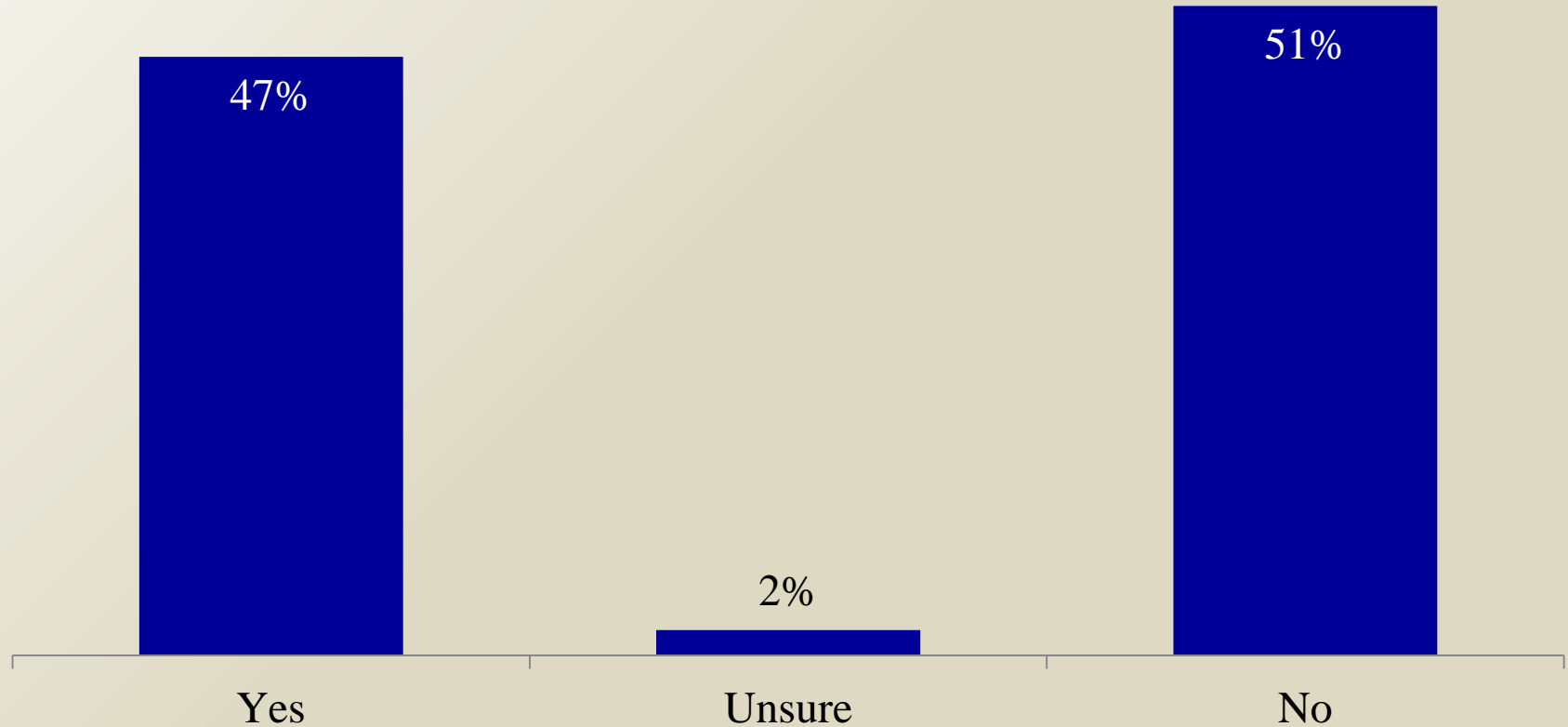
How would you rate the job Congress is doing? Do you approve or disapprove of the job they are doing?

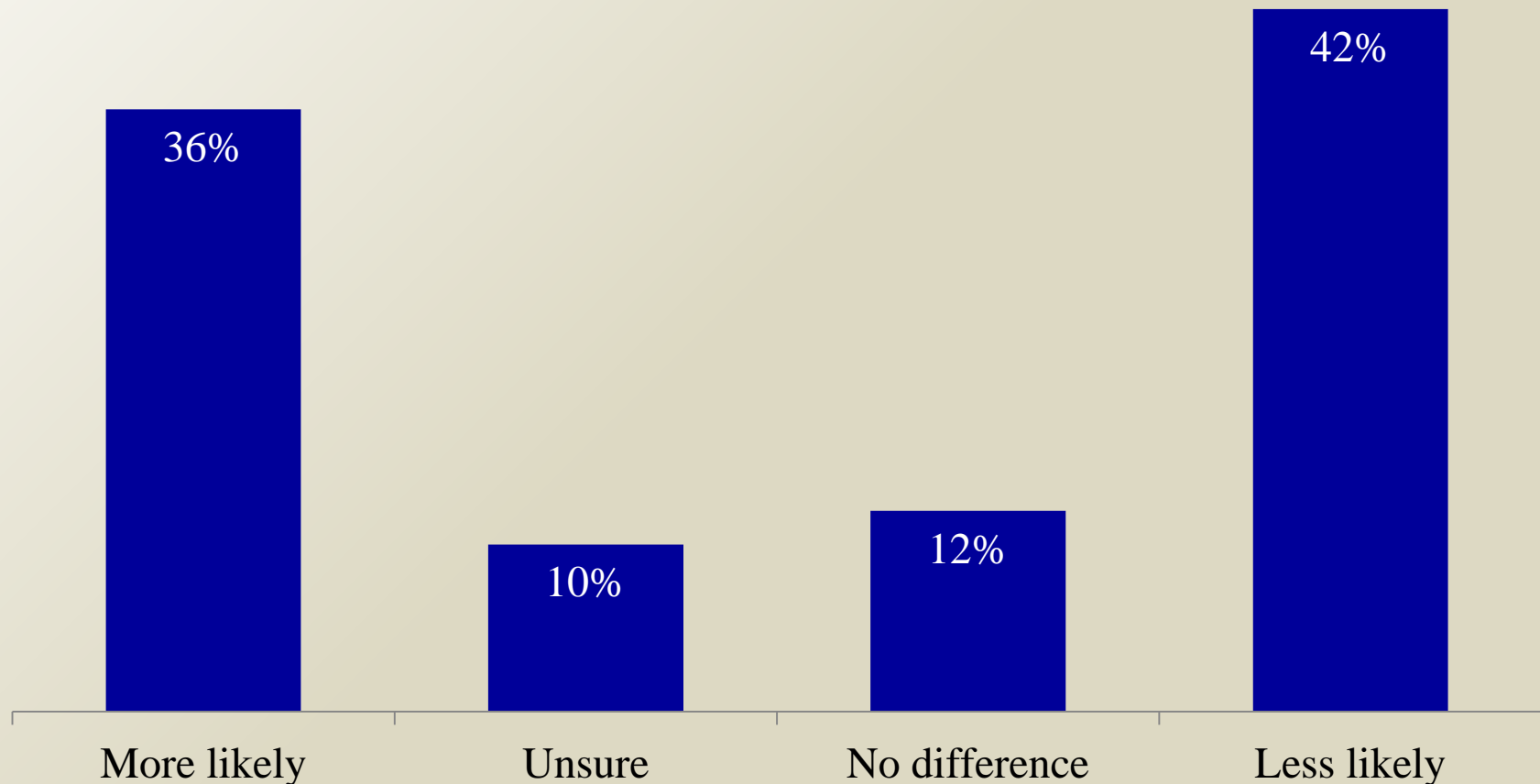


As you may already know, in December Congress passed and the President signed a law to fund the federal government for two years. Have you seen, read or heard anything about this federal budget deal?

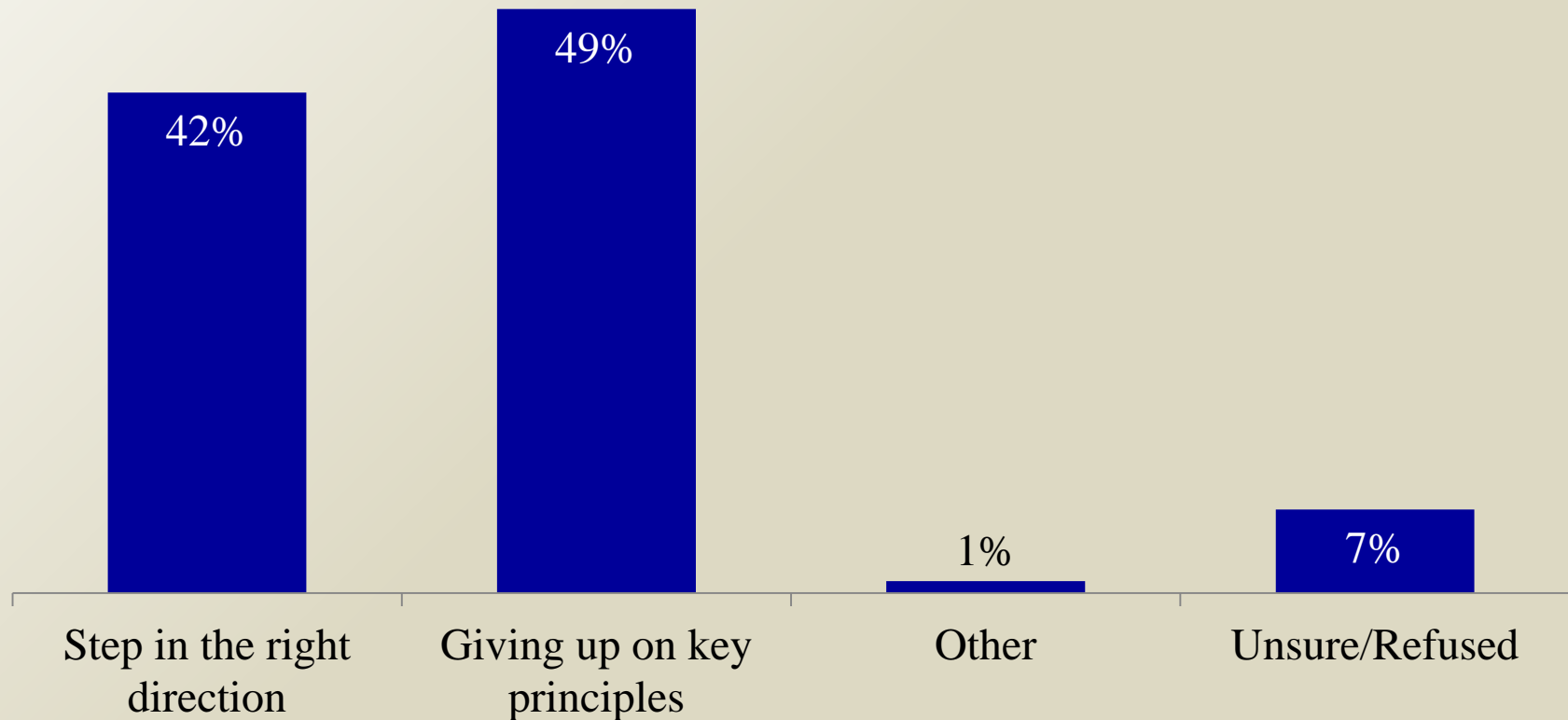


Thinking about what you have seen, read or heard about this budget deal, has it made you more likely or less likely to vote for your Member of Congress?

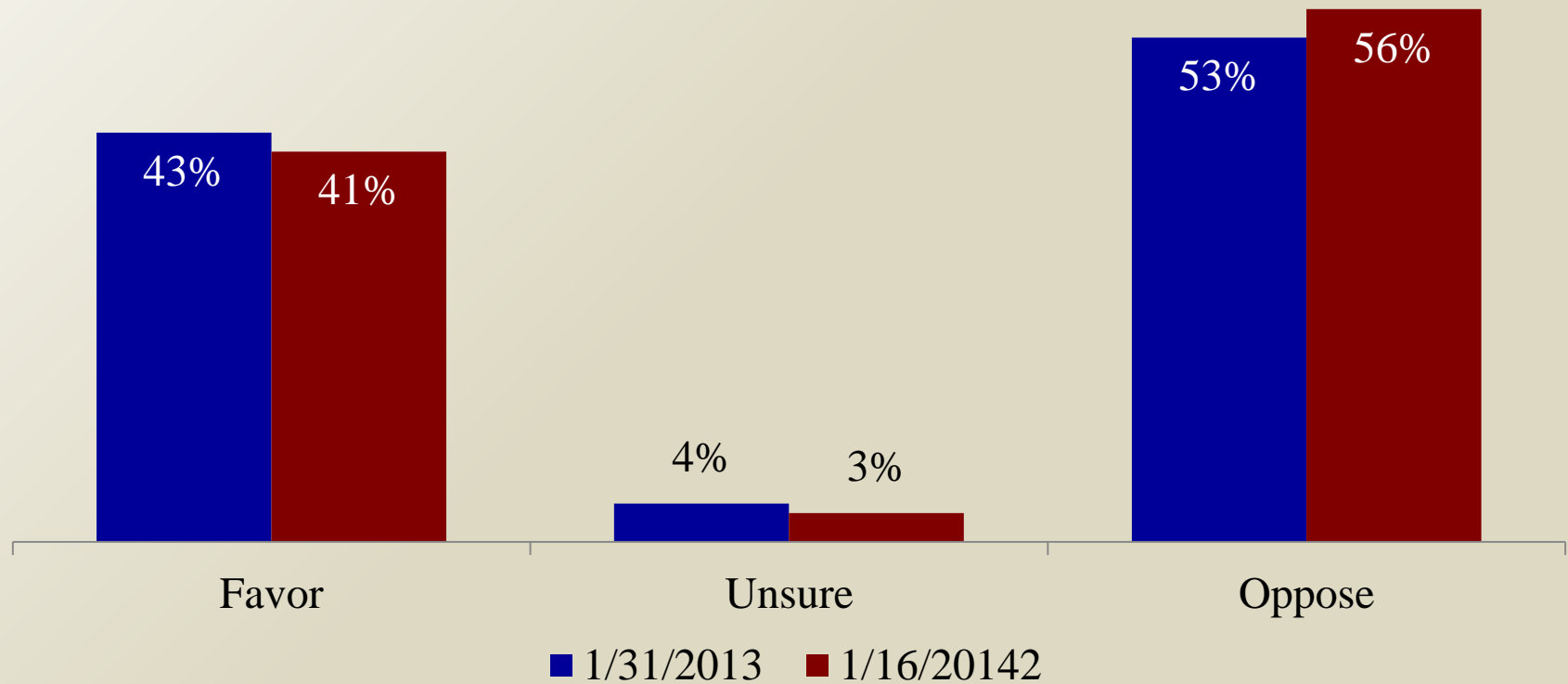


And, based on what you know, do you think this deal was more of a step in the right direction or giving up on key principles?

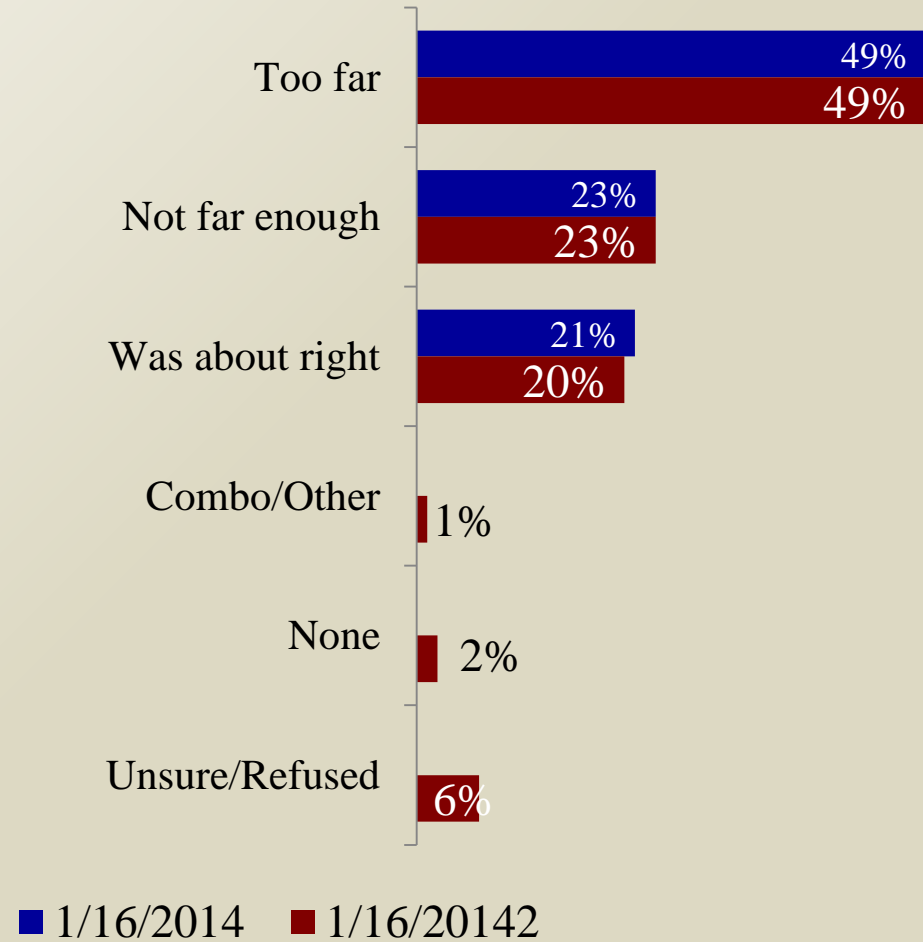




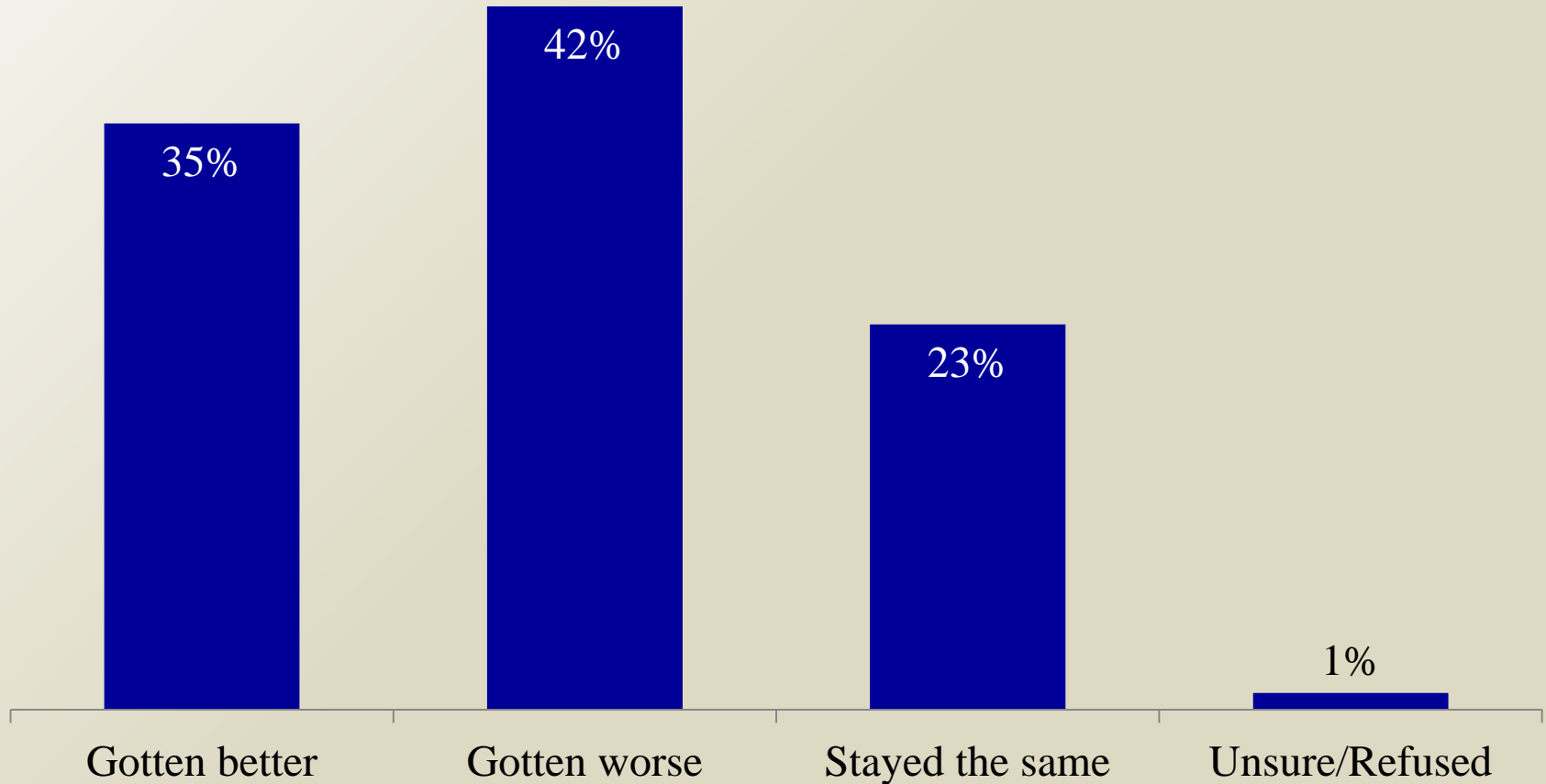
In general, do you favor or oppose the Affordable Care Act, which is also called Obamacare?



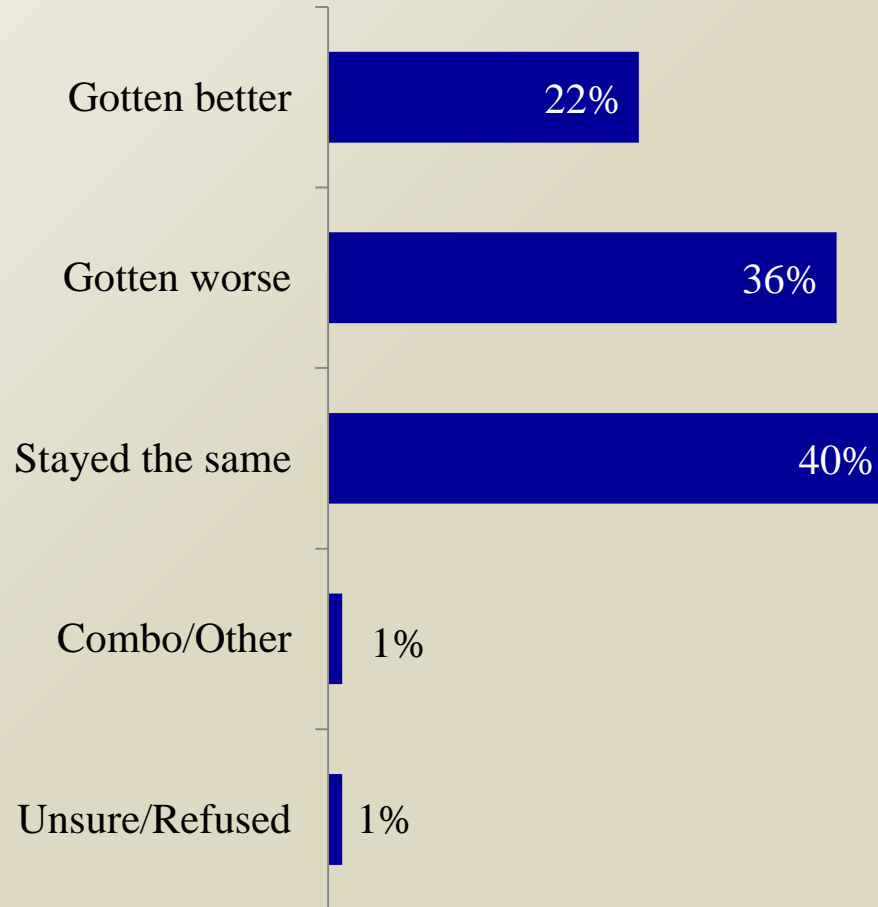
Do you think that the Affordable Care Act, also called Obamacare, went too far, did not go far enough, or was about right?



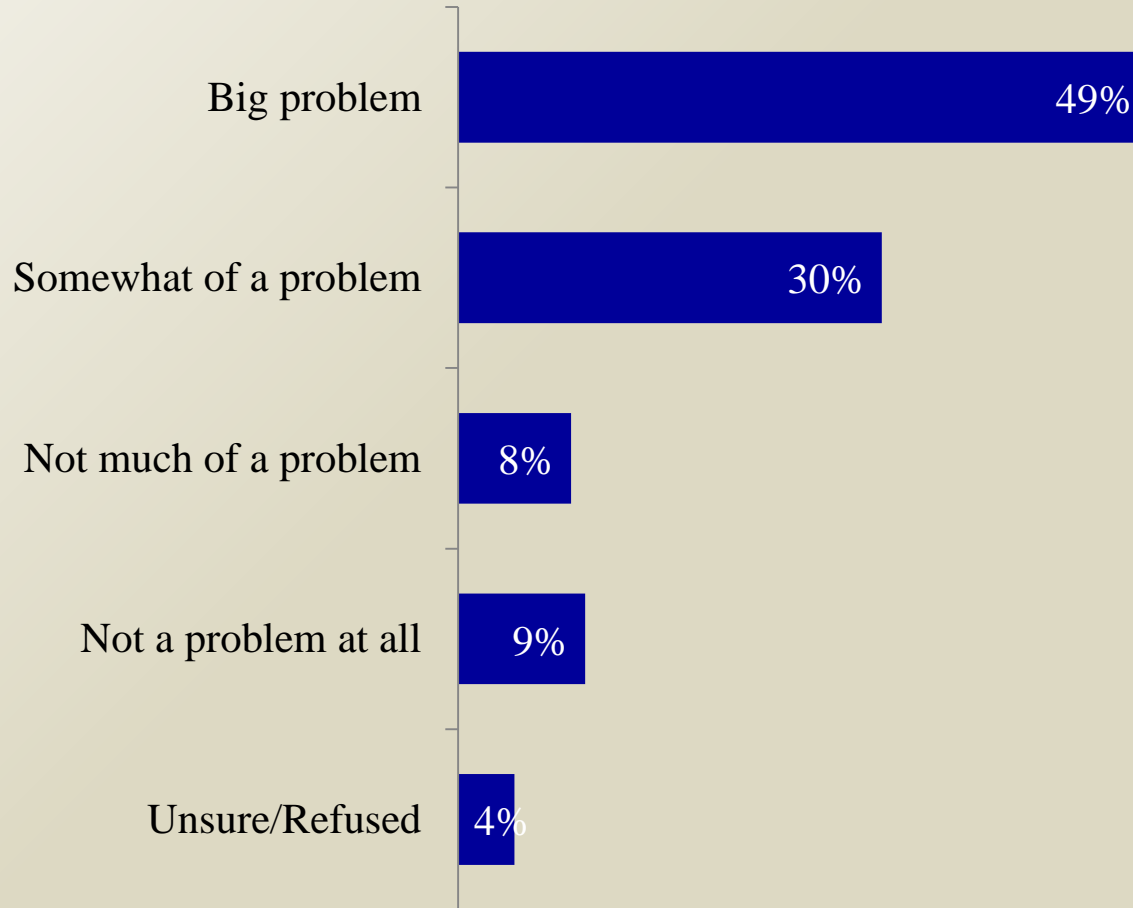
Do you think that the national economy has gotten better, worse, or stayed the same over the past four years?



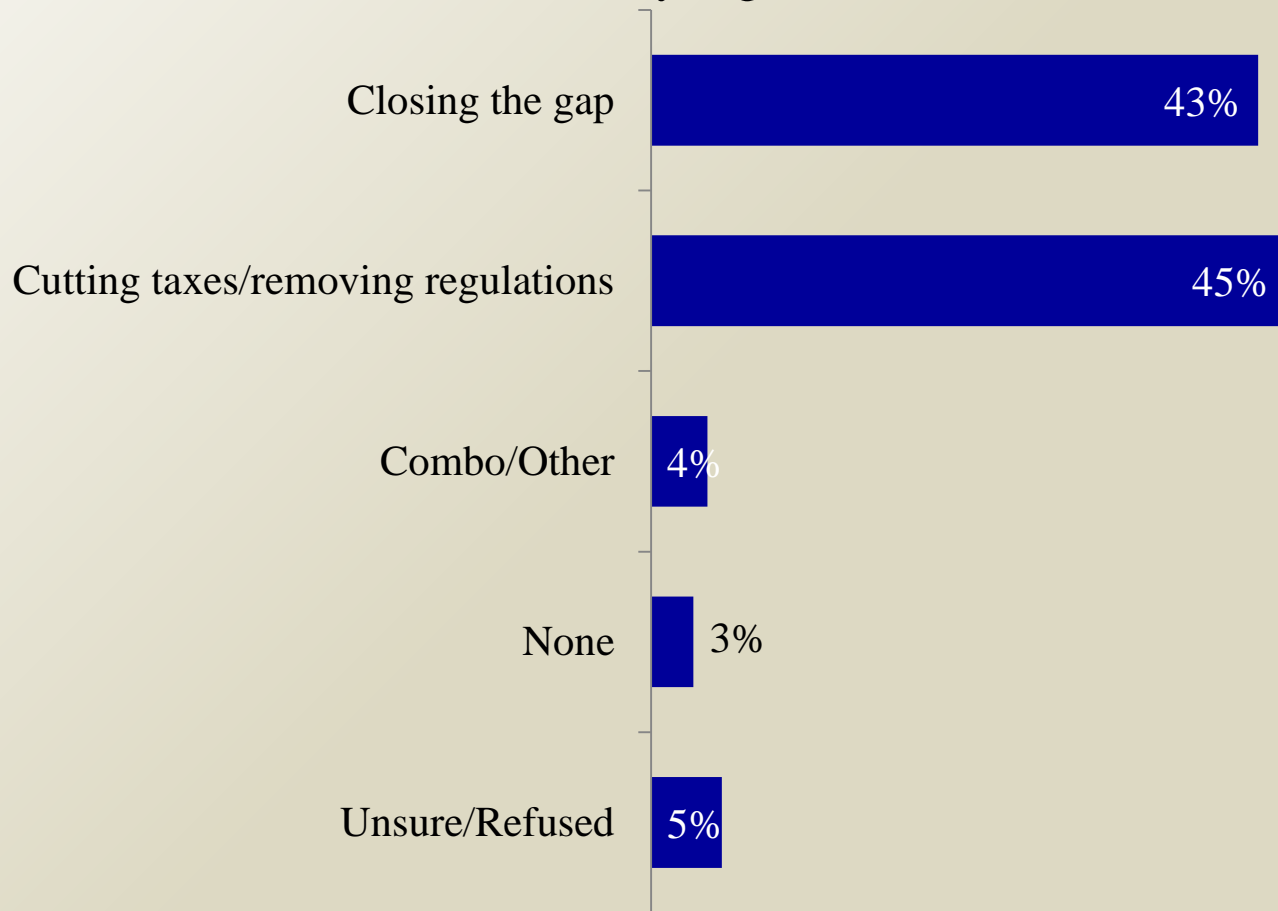
# Do you think that your personal economic situation has gotten better, worse, or stayed the same over the past four years?



How big of a problem would you say that income inequality is? Would you say it is a big problem, somewhat of a problem, not much of a problem, or not a problem at all?

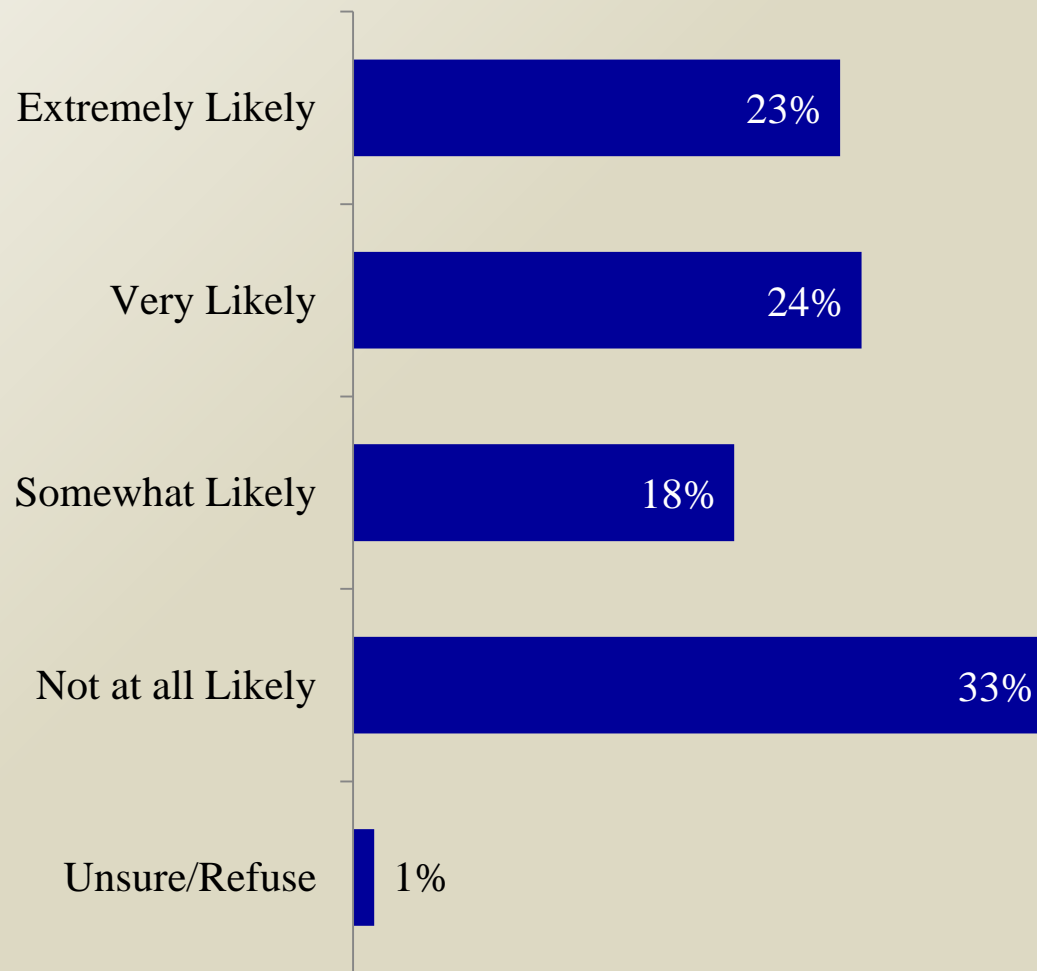

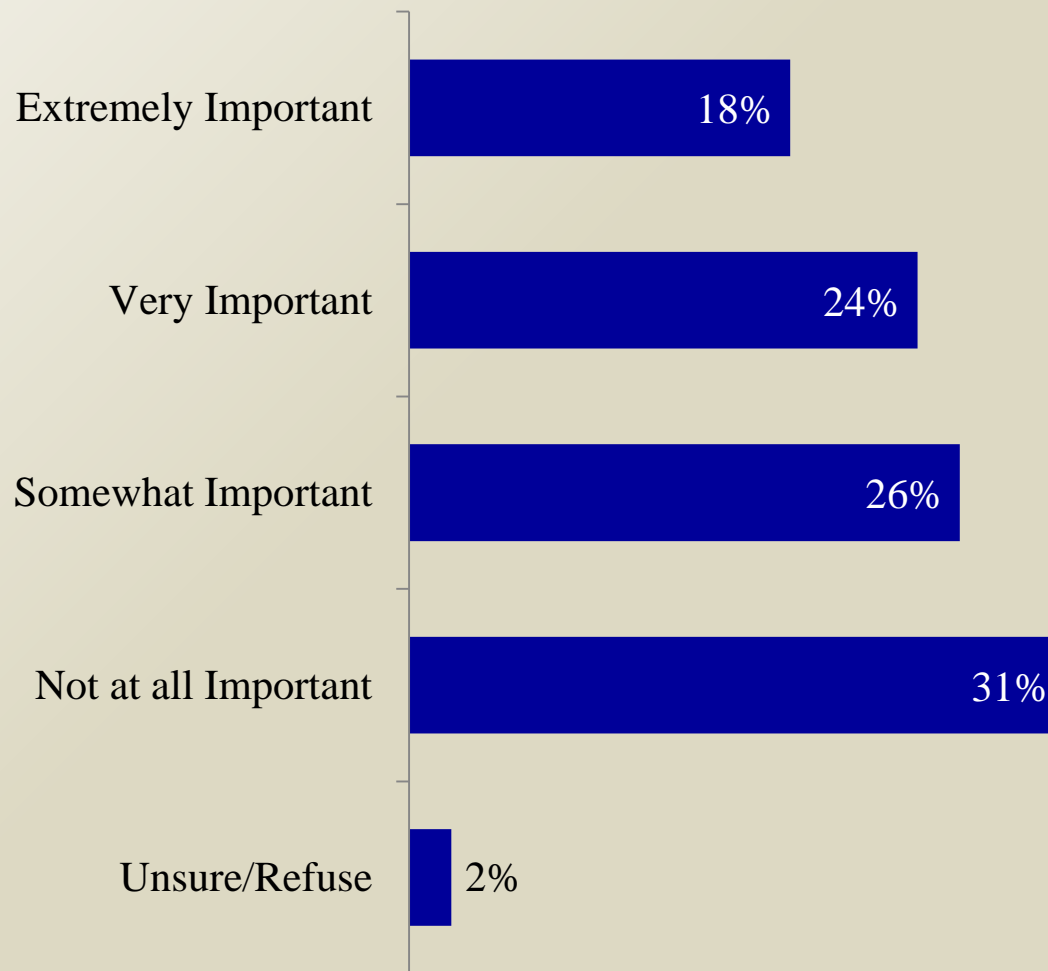

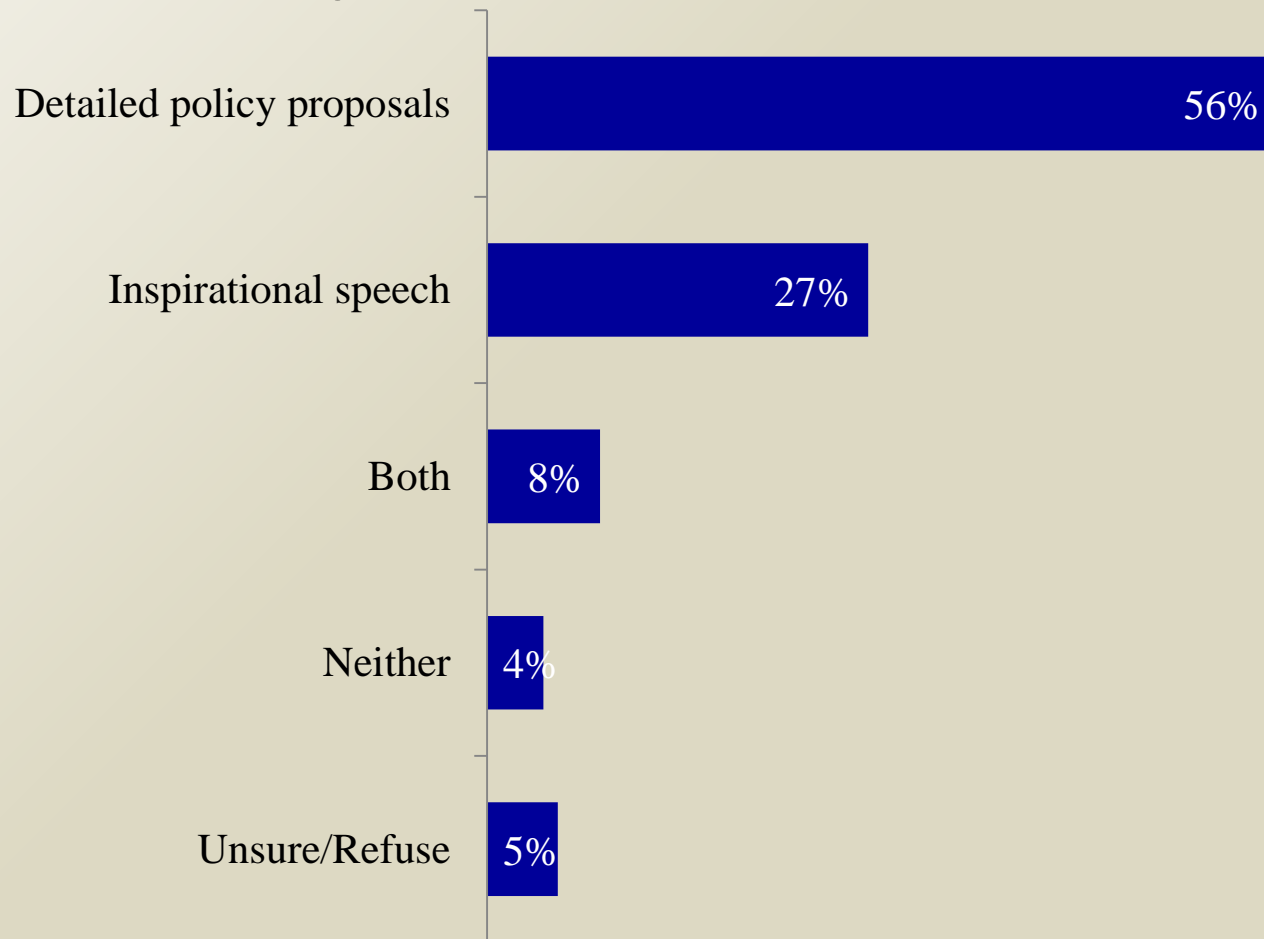


Still thinking about the State of the Union speech, how important do you think this year's speech will be? Would you say this will be extremely important, very important, somewhat important or not very important speech?

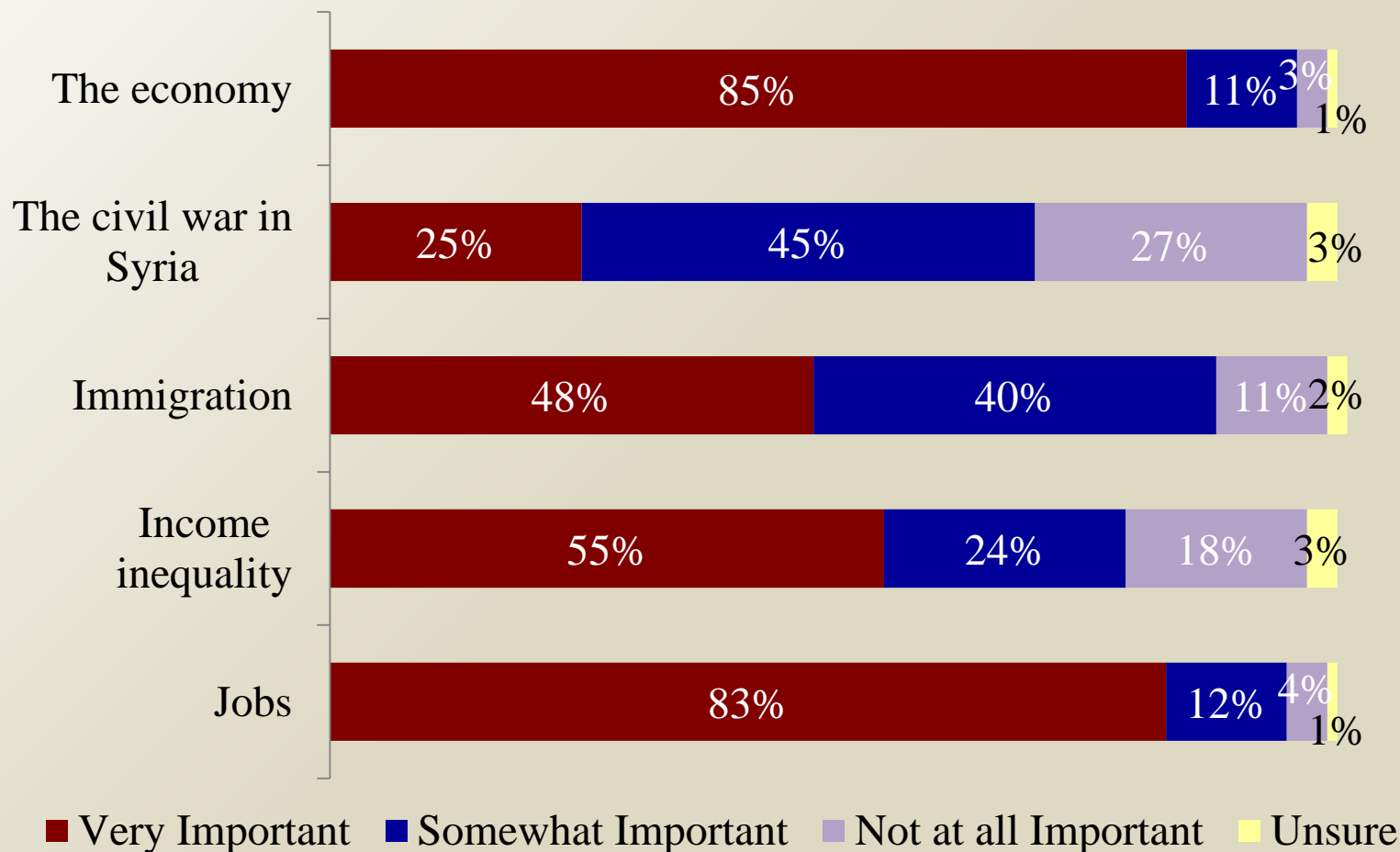
