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### **Snyder Leads Schauer by 5% Peters Leads Land by 3% *Snyder 46% -Schauer 41%* *Peters 45%- Land 42%***

**LANSING, Mich.** —Governor Rick Snyder continues to lead his Democratic challenger, former U.S. Congressman Mark Schauer, while Congressman Gary Peters now leads former Michigan Secretary of State Terri Lynn Land in the U.S. Senate race according to the latest Mitchell Poll of Michigan conducted for MIRS (Michigan Information Research Services) and announced during a presentation for Farmers Group, Inc. at a meeting in Lansing today. However, Snyder's lead has dropped since an April poll while Peters has taken the lead over Land.

According to the new Mitchell Poll, Snyder leads Schauer by 5% (46%-41% with 13% undecided). In an April 9, 2014 survey, Snyder led 49%-37%, a 12% margin. Peters leads Land by 3% (45%-42%) in the latest poll, but he trailed Land by 6% (44%-38%) in April. The automated telephone survey of 961 likely voters in the 2014 General Election was conducted June 6, 2014 by Mitchell Research & Communications, Inc. and has a Margin of Error + or – 3.16% at the 95% level of confidence.

“Governor Snyder’s support has probably eroded as a result of all the tough issues he has been dealing with since April. The results in the governor’s race are really tied almost directly to the Governor’s favorable-unfavorable rating (47%-41%) which is almost identical to the trial ballot question 46%-41%. Schauer’s name ID is only 63% and his favorable-unfavorable rating is 24%-22%. Less than half the voters can say whether they like him or not. The Republicans have been very effective in defining Schauer in a negative way,” Steve Mitchell, chairman of Mitchell Research & Communications, Inc. said.

At the end of campaigns when incumbents are running, the final results are often tied to the percentage of voters who approve of the job the incumbent is doing. If that’s the case this year, it bodes well for Snyder.

“The good news for Snyder is that his job approval is much higher than his favorable rating. Almost six-in-ten voters (58%) approve of the job he is doing while less than four-in-ten (38%) disapprove. With a high job approval and low name ID from his opponent, Governor Snyder is still in a strong position to be re-elected in November,” Mitchell continued.

“In the U.S. Senate campaign, Congressman Peters is much stronger with women than men and has solidified his Democratic base more than Land has solidified her GOP base. More importantly, Peters has a 7% lead with independents. However, this race remains very close. One problem that Peters may have is that a majority of voters (52%) disapprove of the job President Obama is doing as president, while 46% approve. Typically, the party in control of the White House loses seats in the Senate in the election six years into the presidency,” Mitchell said.

A look at key demographics in the governor’s race shows:

- By party (39% identified themselves as Democrats and 35% as Republicans):
  - Snyder has solidified his base and leads among GOP voters 88%-5%.
  - Schauer leads with Democrats 78%-9%.
  - Among the key independent voters, Snyder is up 40%-35%.
- By gender:
  - Snyder leads with men 48%-40% and leads with women 44%-42%.
- By race:
  - Snyder leads with Caucasians 51%-36% but trails with African-Americans 83%-11%
- By area support is at:
  - Schauer leads in Detroit 84%-8%.
  - Snyder leads in Wayne County outside of Detroit 47%-43%.
  - Snyder 47%-43% in Oakland County
  - Schauer 50%-31% in Macomb County
  - Snyder leads 45%-42% in Saginaw/Bay City/Midland/Thumb Area
  - Schauer leads 44%-42% in in Mid-Michigan including Monroe and Washtenaw
  - Snyder leads 56%-34% in West Michigan
  - Snyder leads 47%-32% in Northern Michigan/UP

“The race is close at this time, but Schauer’s low favorable and Snyder’s high job approval, certainly still has the Governor in a very strong position,” Mitchell said.

A look at key demographics in the U.S. Senate race shows:

- By party (39% identified themselves as Democrats and 35% as Republicans):
  - Peters and Land both have 83% of their party’s support.
  - Among the key independent voters, Peters is up 40%-35%.

- By gender:
  - Peters and Land are tied at 44% with men while Peters leads with women 45%-40%.
  
- By race:
  - Land leads with Caucasians 46%-41%, but that is not nearly as good as Snyder's 51%-36% lead with white voters.
  - Peter's lead with African-Americans 82%-8% is almost identical to Schauer's lead with black voters (83%-11%).
  
- By area support is at:
  - Peters leads in Detroit 87%-8%.
  - Peters and Land are tied at 46% in Wayne County outside of Detroit. Snyder led by 47%-43% there.
  - Peters leads 48%-44% in Oakland, almost opposite of Snyder's 47%-43% lead.
  - Peters leads 54%-35% in Macomb where led Schauer 50%-31%.
  - Peters leads 41%-39% in Saginaw/Bay City/Midland/Thumb Area where Snyder leads 45%-42%.
  - Peters leads 49%-36% in Mid-Michigan including Monroe and Washtenaw where Schauer leads 44%-42%.
  - In her home area, Land leads Peters 49%-35% in West Michigan where Snyder leads 56%-34%.
  - Peters leads 42%-41% in Northern Michigan/UP where Snyder leads 47%-32%

“The U.S. Senate race is close at this time. However, Republicans will try to connect Peters to Obama and the President is not popular. Fifty-seven percent of those who say they will be either voting for a party other than Democrats and Republicans (6% of all voters) or are independents (20% of all voters) disapprove of the job Obama is doing. If they break towards Land, that would be enough for Land to win. However, Peters is solidifying women voters while breaking even with men, if he continues to do that he will win,” Mitchell concluded.
