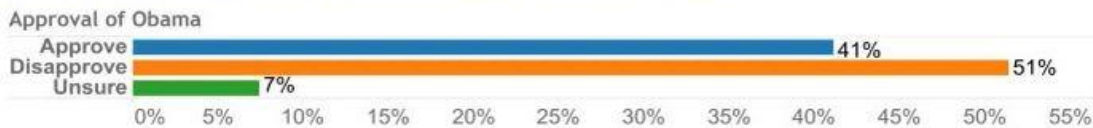


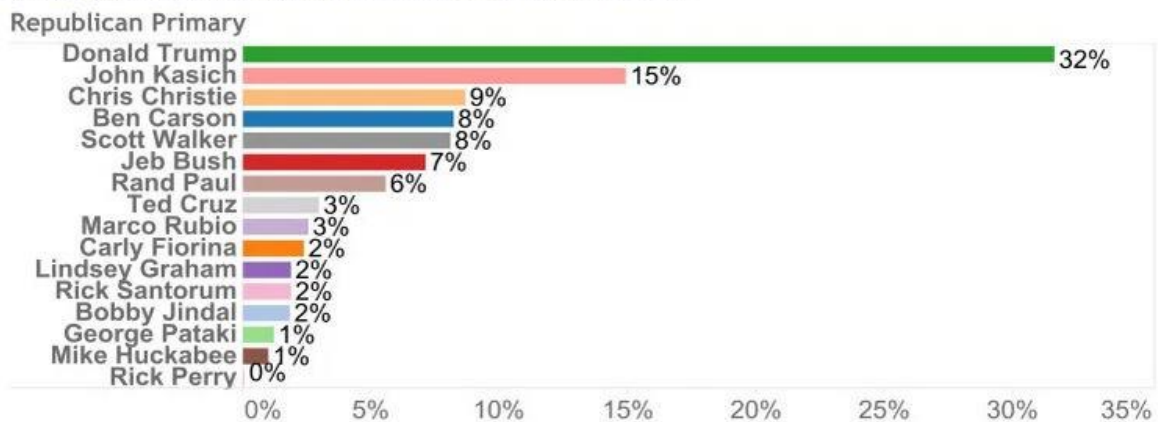
New Hampshire Polling Results

Gravis Marketing, a nonpartisan research firm, conducted a random survey of 1,179 registered voters in New Hampshire regarding the presidential election. The sample includes 599 Republican Primary participants, 475 Democratic Primary participants, and the remainder planning to vote in 2016, but will not participate in the primary elections. The poll has a margin of error of $\pm 2.9\%$ [4.0% for Republican Caucus/4.5% for Democratic Caucus]. The total may not round to 100% because of rounding. The polls were conducted using IVR technology and weighted separately for each population in the question presented. The poll was conducted for One America News Network.

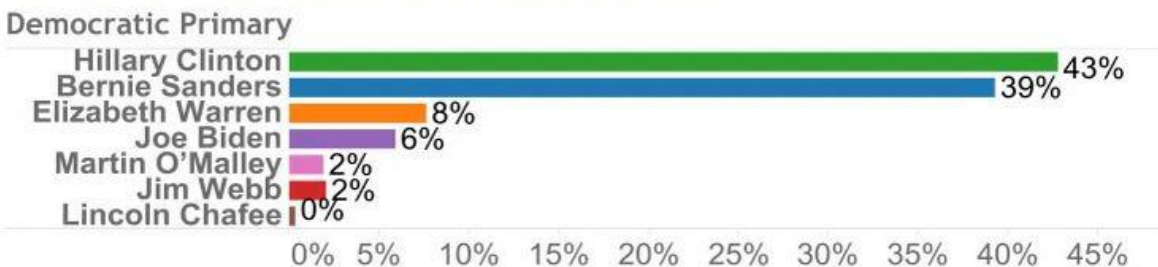
Do approve or disapprove of President Obama's Job Performance?



Assuming you had to vote today, which 2016 GOP Candidate would you vote for?

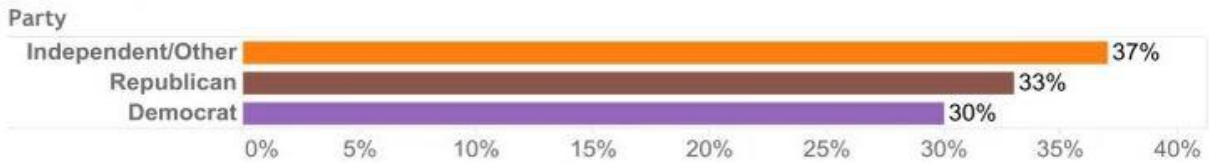


Assuming you had to vote today, which 2016 Democrat Candidate would you vote for?

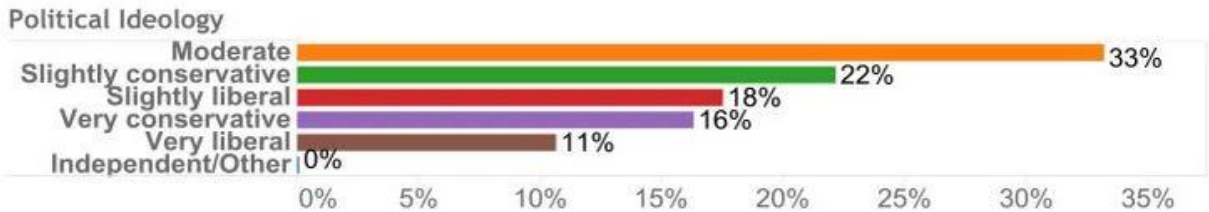

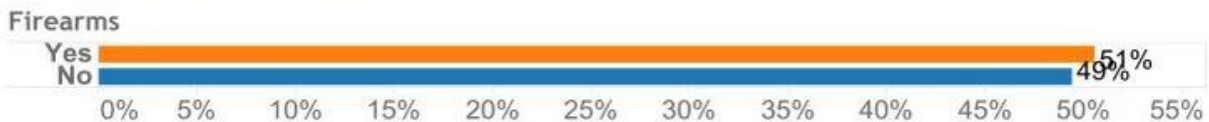

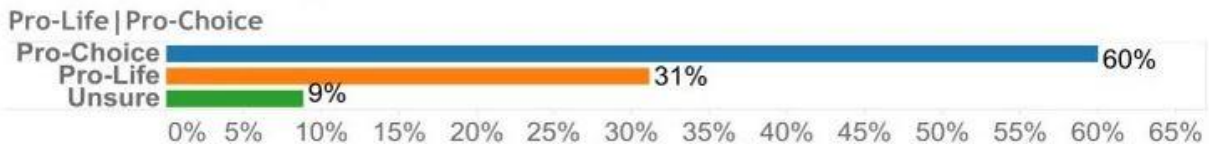

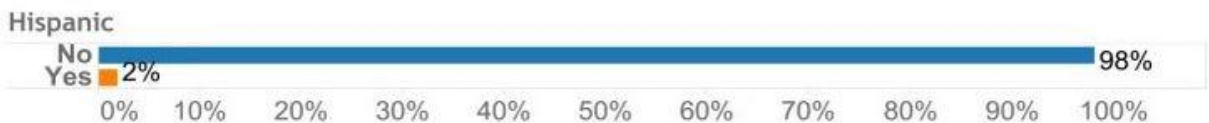
Do you or anyone in your family own a gun or firearm?



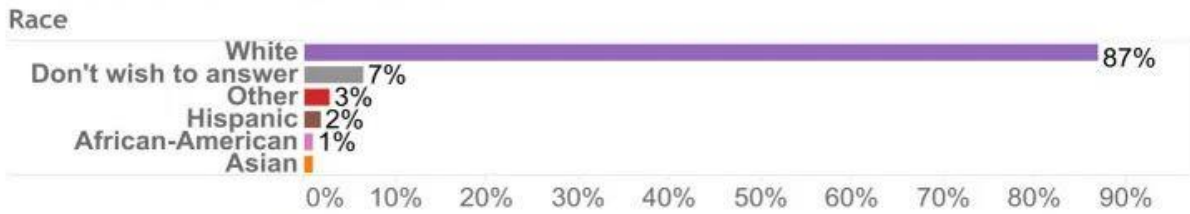
Do you consider yourself to be Pro-Life or Pro-Choice when it comes to the question of whether or not abortion should be legal?



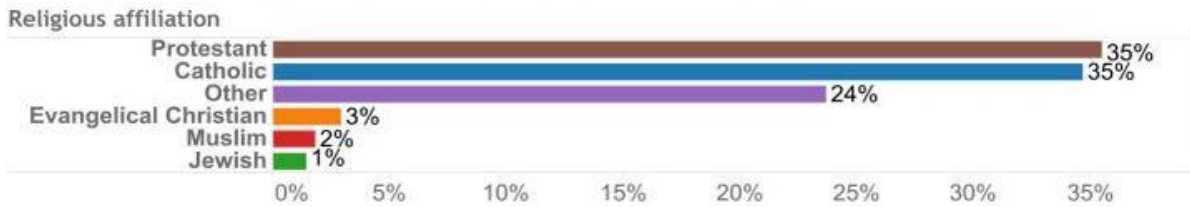
Are you or is a member of your immediate family from a Latino, Hispanic or Spanish speaking background?



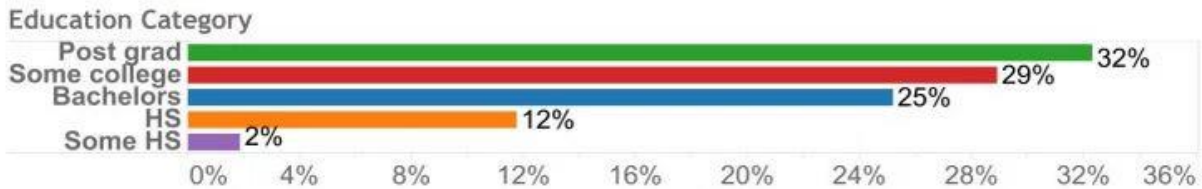
What race do you identify yourself as?



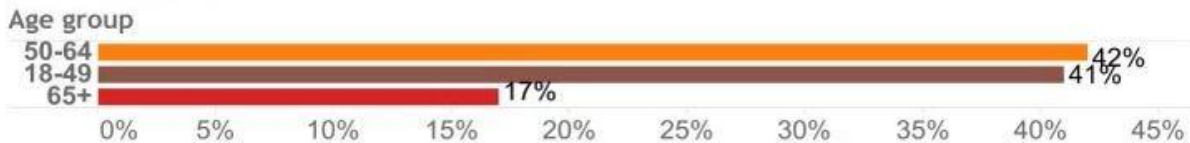
Which of the following best represents your religious affiliation?



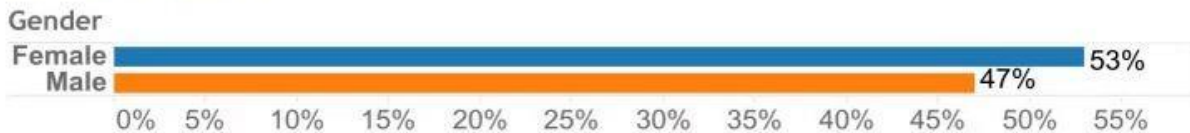
What is the highest level of education have you completed?
