Trump Still Strong – Kasich in Second *(Trump 41% - Kasich 23% - Cruz 18% - Rubio 8%)*

EAST LANSING, Michigan --- Donald Trump continues to lead by 18 percentage points going into the Republican Presidential Primary Election in Michigan tomorrow. Trump (41%) leads Ohio Governor John Kasich (23%), Texas U.S. Senator Ted Cruz (18%), Florida U.S. Senator Marco Rubio (8%) and Dr. Ben Carson (3%) while 1% is voting for someone else and 6% are undecided according to the latest Mitchell/FOX 2 Detroit - Michigan Poll.

The IVR (Interactive Voice Response) automated survey of 472 likely March 8, 2016 Michigan Republican Presidential Primary voters was conducted by Mitchell Research & Communications Monday night, March 7, 2016 and has a Margin of Error of + or – 4.5% at the 95% level of confidence.

“Donald Trump maintains a strong lead going into the Michigan Primary tomorrow. John Kasich (23%), who has campaigned in the state for the past week, has moved into second while Ted Cruz (18%) has dropped to third. Marco Rubio (8%) dropped another point and will not be a factor in the race. There are still 5% undecided, and in other states these voters have gone to candidates other than Trump, so the margin could close based on late deciders going to Kasich and Cruz.

“Trump looks likely to win, but Cruz has a strong ground operation in Michigan. The big problem for Kasich and Cruz is that they are both doing well and therefore making it more difficult for each to win. Mitt Romney’s endorsement of Marco Rubio could garner him more support. Meanwhile, Trump’s support doesn’t seem to have fallen as it did in all four states Saturday, where he did not do nearly as well as pre-election day polling said he would do,” Steve Mitchell, CEO of Mitchell Research & Communications said.

Here are some key demographic breakouts:

- Trump continues to be stronger with men (48%) than women (35%). Trump dropped 5% with women since last night. .

- Sixty percent of Trump voters strongly agree that they “are mad as hell and they won’t take it anymore.” Second are Cruz supporters (29%). Clearly, the angry voters support Trump.
- Voters are solidifying behind their candidates. Trump (90%) is ahead of the other candidates in the percentage that say they are “definitely” voting for their candidate. Kasich (84%), Cruz (77%), and Rubio (77%) follow Trump.
- We asked voters if they would identify themselves as Evangelical Christians to see who is winning with that demographic group in Michigan. On Thursday, Trump (44%) led Cruz (21%) with evangelicals. Last night, Trump (34%) still led (27%), but by a smaller margin. Tonight, Trump (30%) trails Cruz (36%).
- We also wanted to see if the disagreement Trump had with Pope Francis would impact Trump’s support with Roman Catholics and found that it clearly did not. Trump (43%) leads Rubio (8%) Kasich (20%) and Cruz (12%) with Catholics. Trump (49%) is stronger with non-church goers and weakest with Protestants (32% of the vote).
- Trump is getting 49% of the vote of those who have already voted by absentee and 40% of those definitely voting tomorrow. He is ahead by only 6% with those who say they will be probably voting.

Methodology:

Mitchell Research & Communications used a sample of likely voters in the November 2016 Michigan General Election. Our goal is to spread as wide a net as possible to assure we survey voters who may not have voted in primary elections before. A quadruple filter was used to determine that we were surveying only likely Republican Party Primary voters.

- First voters had to say they were registered voters. If they were not, the phone call ended.
- Then, they were asked if they were definitely voting, probably voting, not sure yet, or definitely not voting in the November General Election. If they were “definitely not voting” the phone call ended.
- Then they were asked if they were definitely voting, probably voting, not sure yet, definitely not voting, or if they had already voted by absentee ballot in the March 8th Presidential Primary. If they were “definitely not voting” the call ended.
- Finally, they were informed that they could only vote in on party’s primary, not in both. They were asked if they were voting in the Democratic Party Primary, the Republican Party Primary, or if they were not sure. If respondents said “Democratic” or “not sure” the call ended, so we were only polling those who said they were voting in the Republican Party Primary Election.

We asked Mark Grebner of Practical Political Consulting, considered to be the top list vendor and leading voter demographer in Michigan, and the person who supplied us with our sample, to give us his estimate on voter turnout by age, gender, and race.

We compared final results to determine if the data needed to be weighed to reflect the demographics of the likely voters. In this poll, weighting was done by gender because the sample had a higher percentage of women than we anticipate.

Federal law only permits us to call land lines. Because likely Primary voters are older, almost five -in-ten (47%) are 60 or older and eight-in-ten (81%) are older than 50, there are sufficient land line voters to get an accurate sample. We do not have to make any assumptions of likely voter turnout.
