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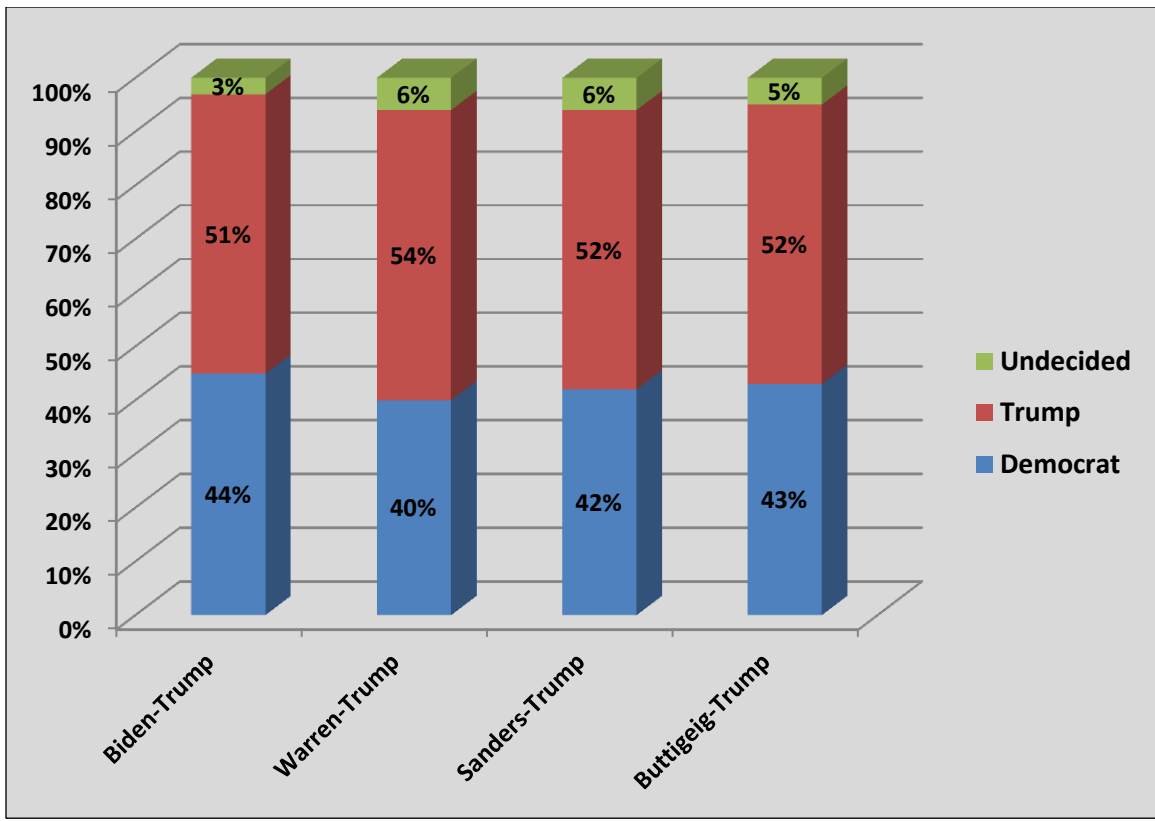
MAJORITY OF GEORGIA VOTERS BACK TRUMP OVER DEMOCRATS

Georgia has not voted for a Democratic presidential candidate since 1992 or elected a Democratic governor since 1998. However, Democrats have pushed hard in the last several national and state election cycles to turn the state blue, but without success.

Currently, it appears that they continue to face an uphill battle heading into the 2020 election, at least when it comes to the presidential election. Ten months ahead of the election, a majority of Georgia voters support Republican President Donald Trump in head-to-head match-ups against each of his four leading potential Democratic challengers.

Statewide, Trump holds a comfortable 51%-44% advantage over Joe Biden, who appears to be his strongest opponent. Trump is even farther ahead of the other top Democrats, leading Elizabeth Warren (54%-40%), Bernie Sanders (52%-42%) and Pete Buttigeig (52%-43%).

HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

This poll was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling & Strategy of Jacksonville, Florida from December 19 through December 23, 2019. A total of 625 registered Georgia voters statewide were interviewed live by telephone.

Those interviewed were selected randomly from a telephone-matched Georgia voter registration list that included both land line and cell phone numbers. Quotas were assigned to reflect voter registration by county.

The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than ± 4 percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping.
