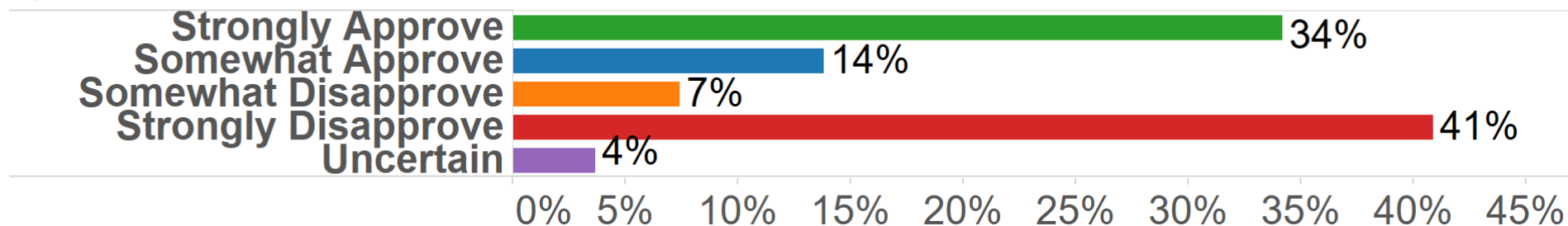

Executive Summary

Gravis Marketing, a nonpartisan research firm, conducted a random survey of 723 registered, likely voters in Florida. The poll was conducted from August 21st through the 22nd and has a margin of error of $\pm 3.7\%$. The totals may not round to 100% because of rounding. The survey was conducted using interactive voice responses and an online panel of cell phone users. The results are weighted by voting demographics. The poll was paid for by Gravis Marketing.

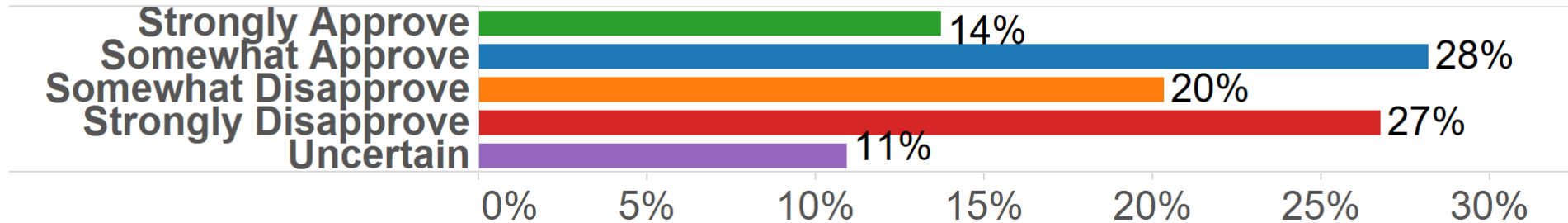

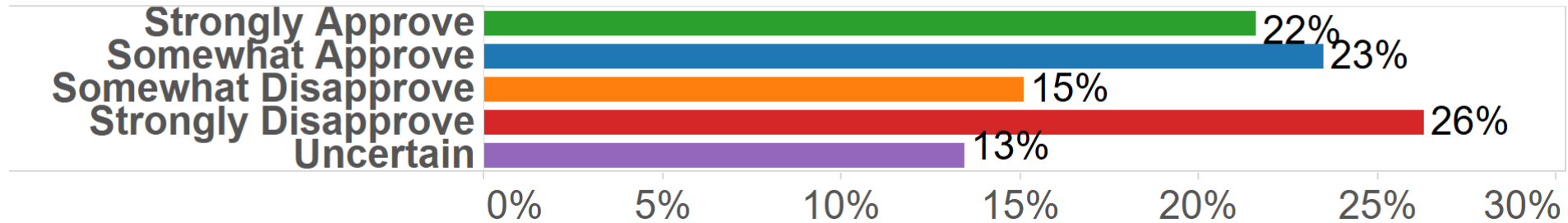

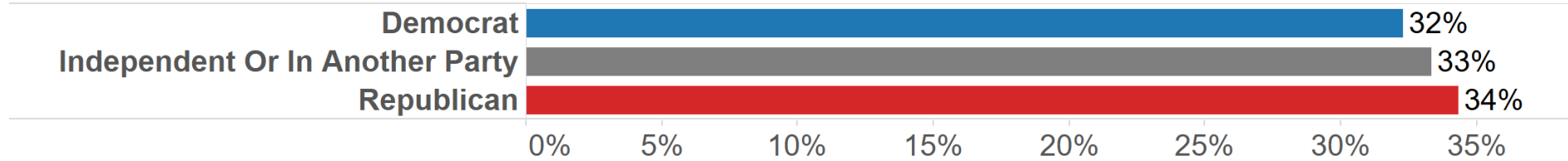

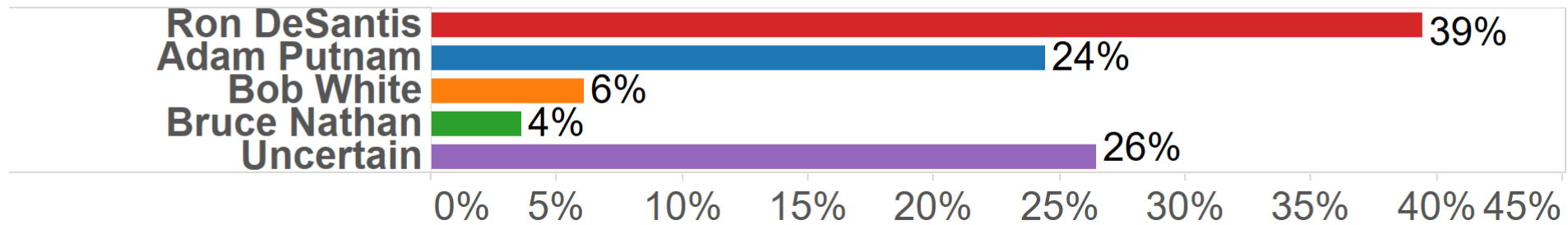

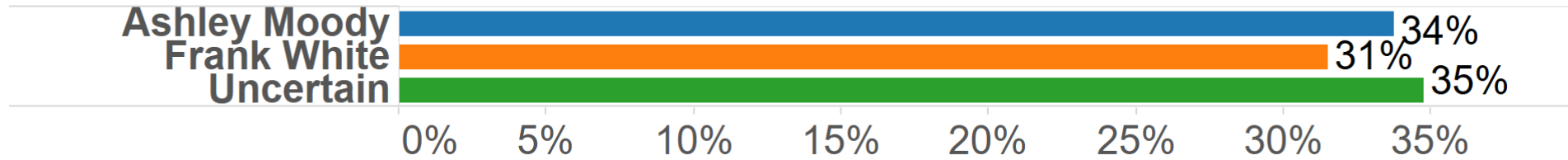

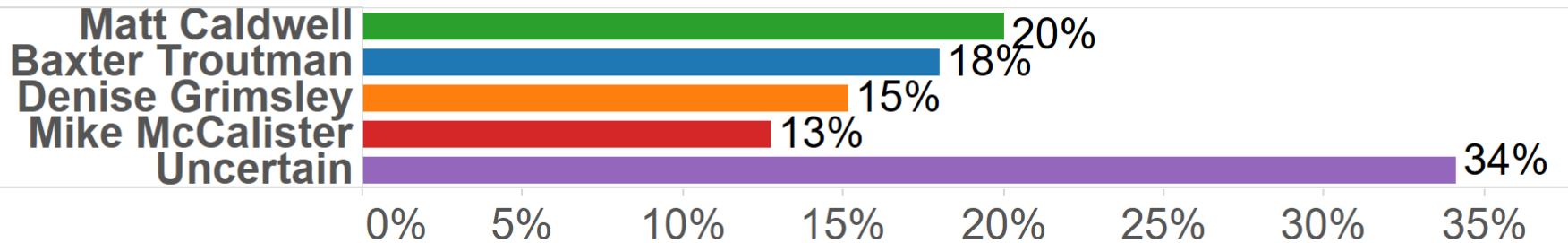

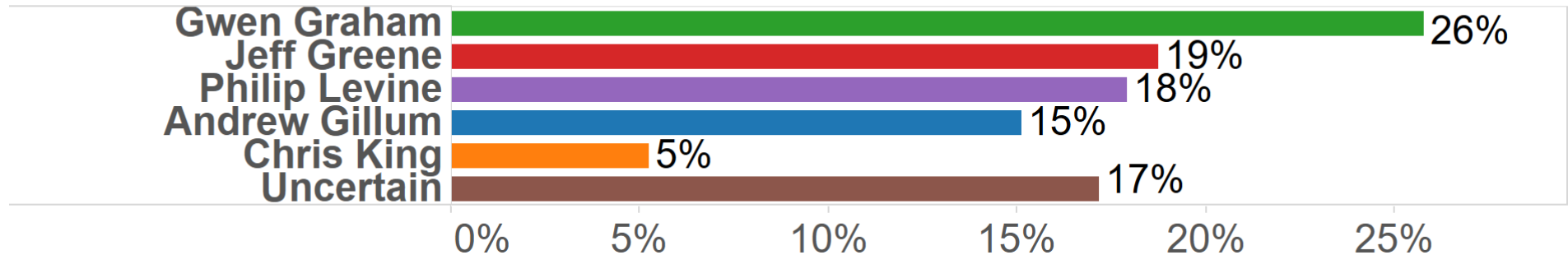

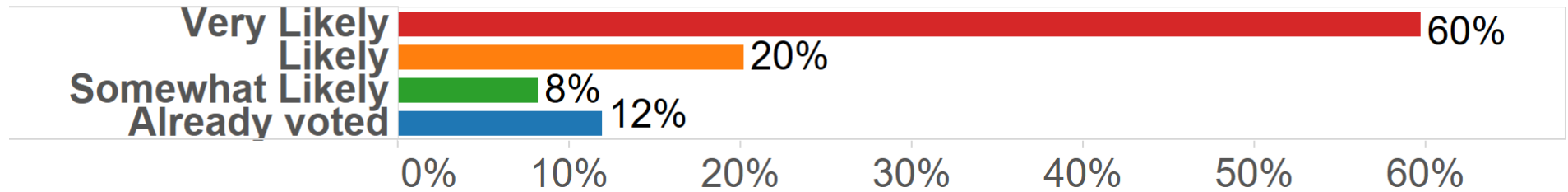

Q1: REGISTERED



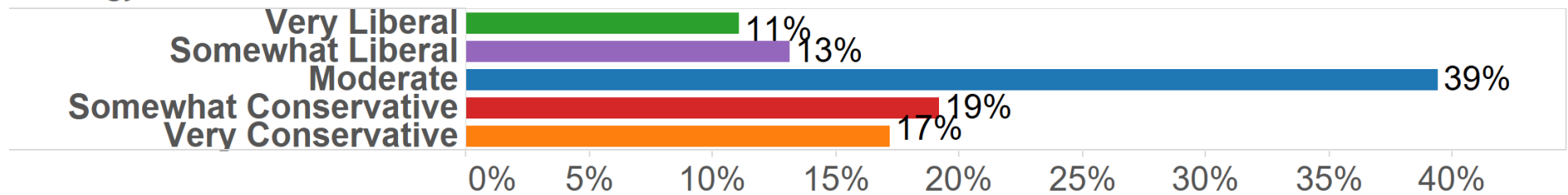
2) How likely are you to vote in the upcoming Florida Primary Elections?

Q2: LIKELIHOOD



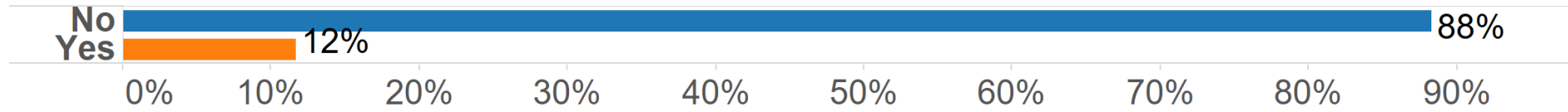

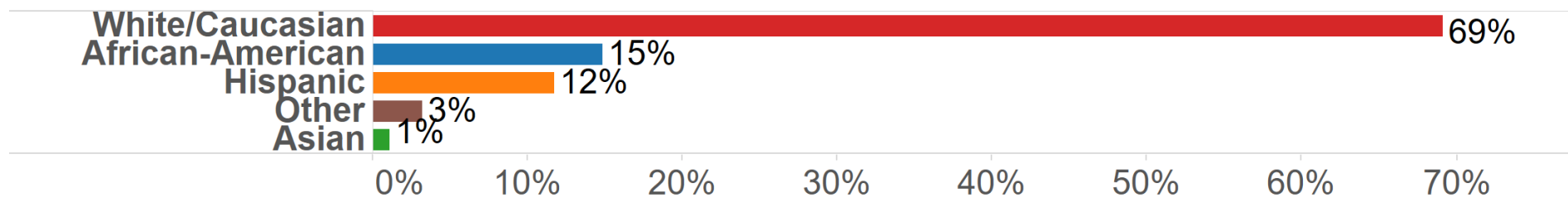
14) Are you or is a member of your immediate family from a Latino, Hispanic or Spanish speaking background?

Hispanic



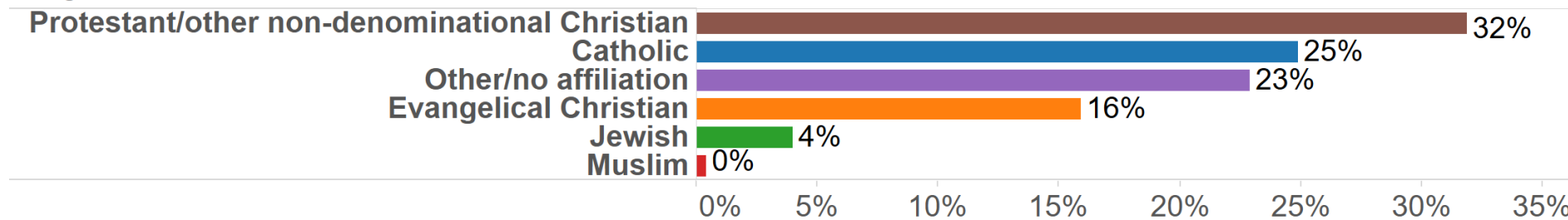
15) What race do you identify yourself as?

Race



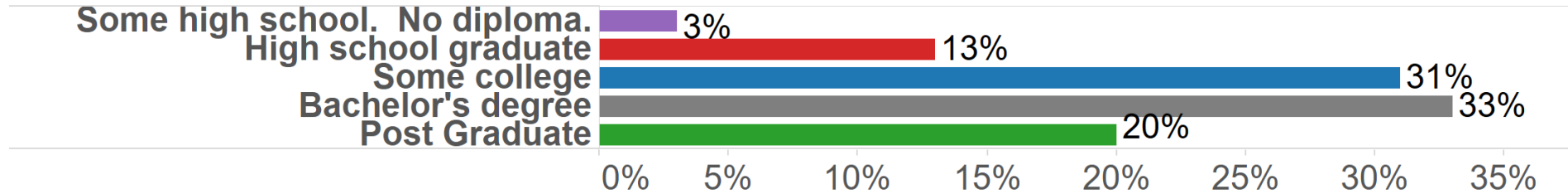
16) Which of the following best represents your religious affiliation?

Religious affiliation



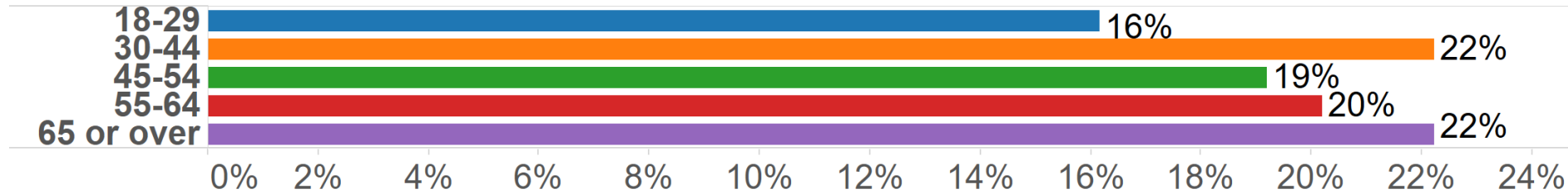
17) What is the highest level of education you have completed?
