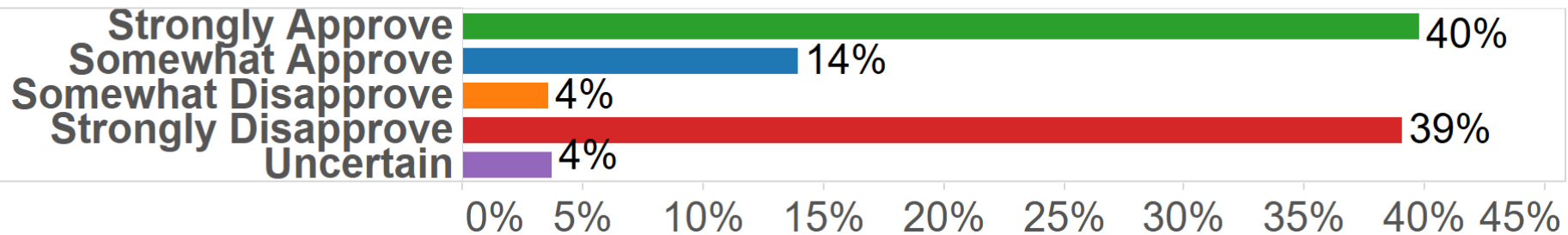

Executive Summary

Gravis Marketing, a nonpartisan research firm, conducted a random survey of 753 likely voters in Florida. The poll was conducted from October 29th through November 2nd, with a margin of error of $\pm 3.6\%$. The totals may not round to 100% because of rounding. The survey was conducted using interactive voice responses and an online panel of cell phone users. The results are weighted by voting demographics. The poll was Paid for by Gravis Marketing.

3) Do you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove, or strongly disapprove of President Trump’s job performance?

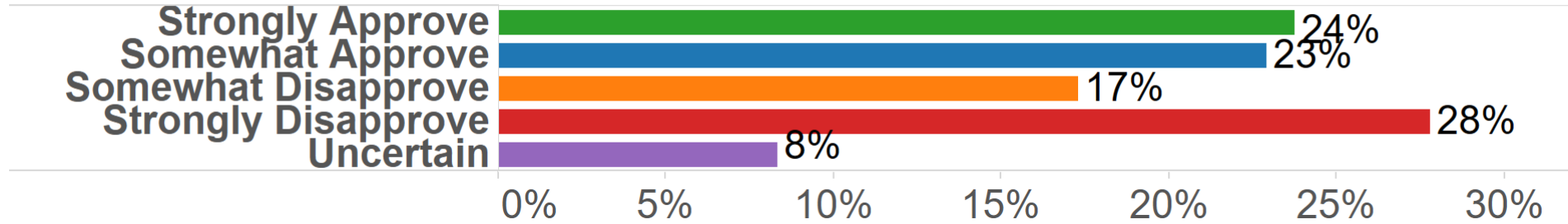

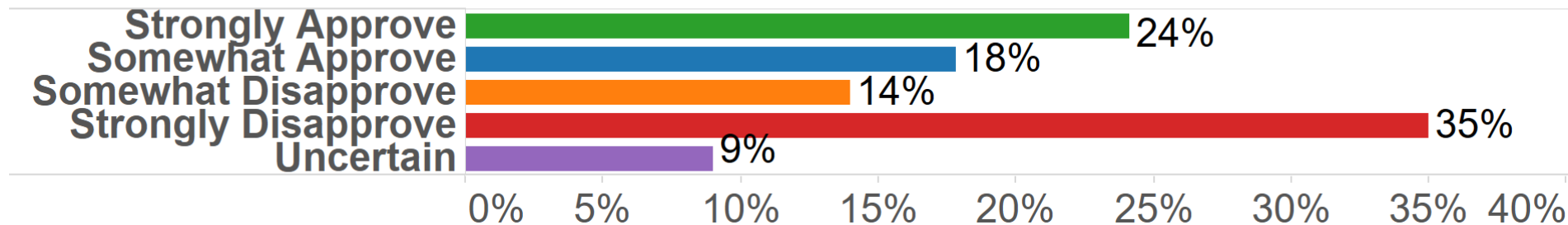

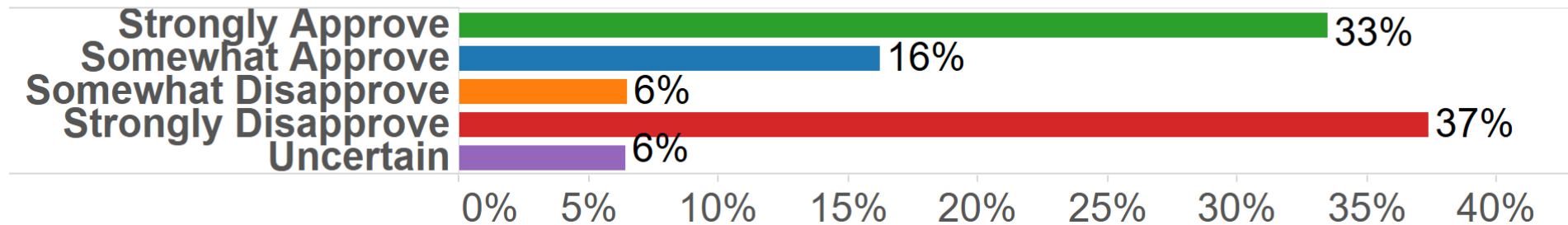

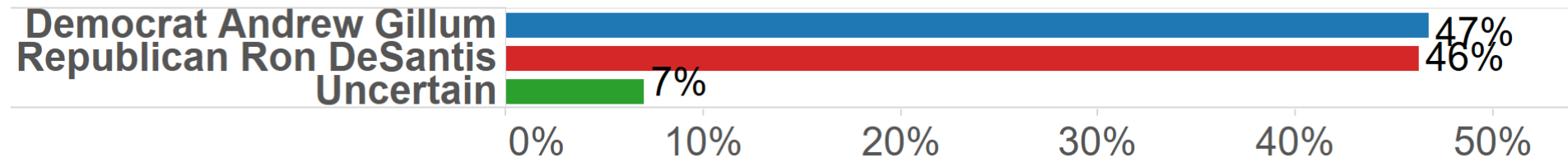

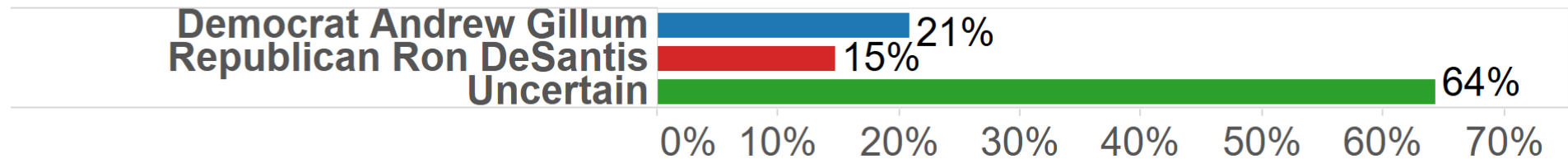

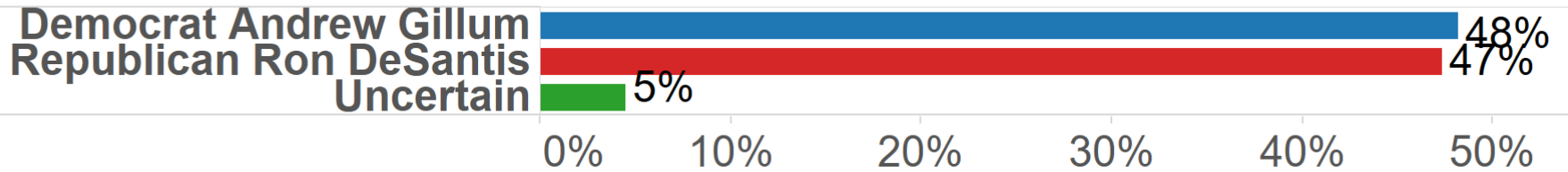

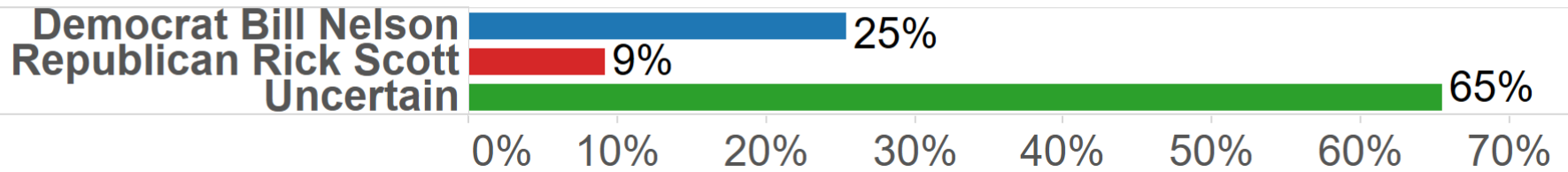

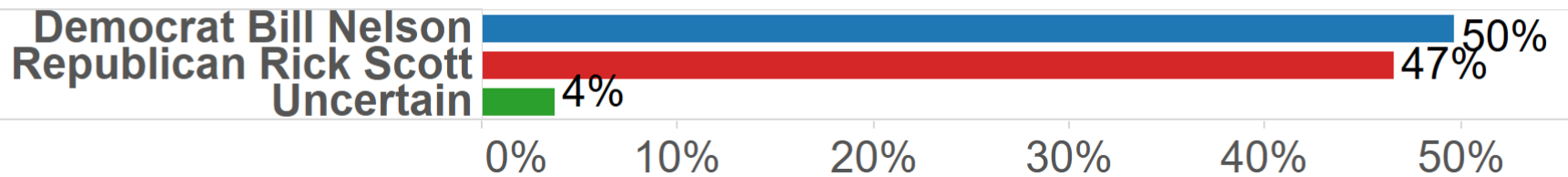

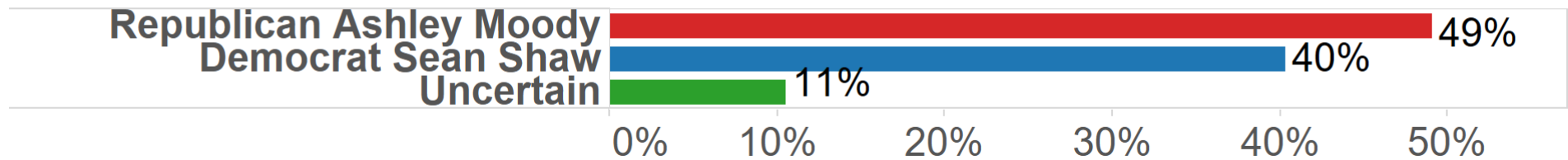

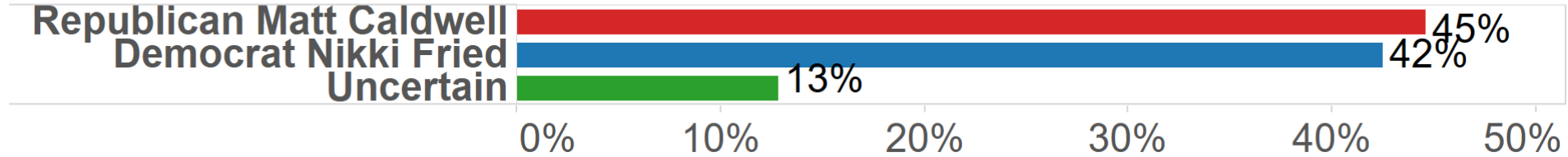

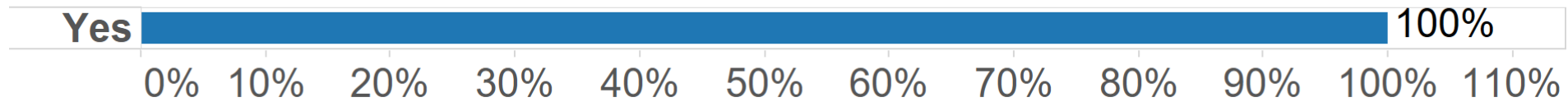

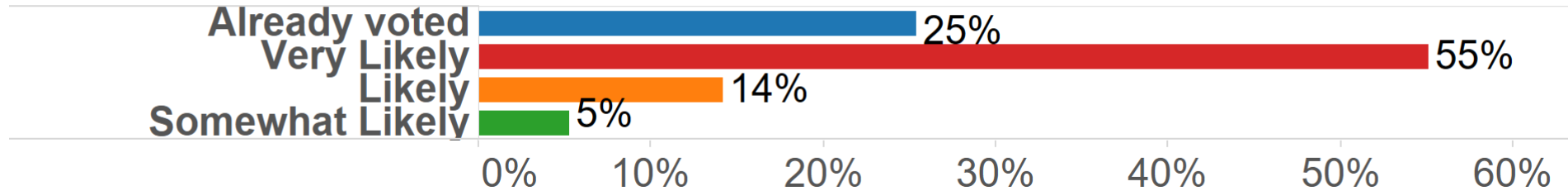

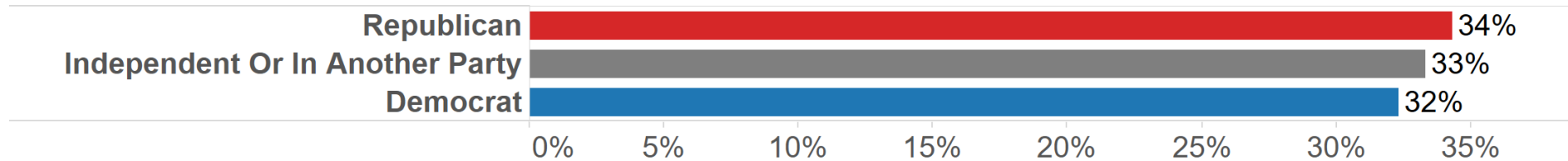
2) How likely are you to vote in the upcoming Florida General Elections?

LIKELIHOOD



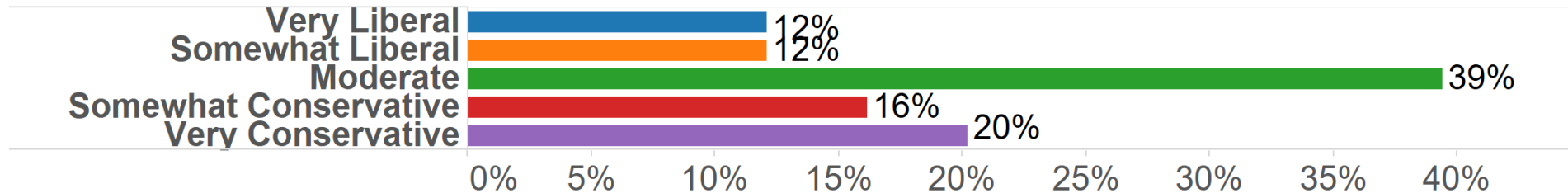
10) What is your party affiliation?

Party



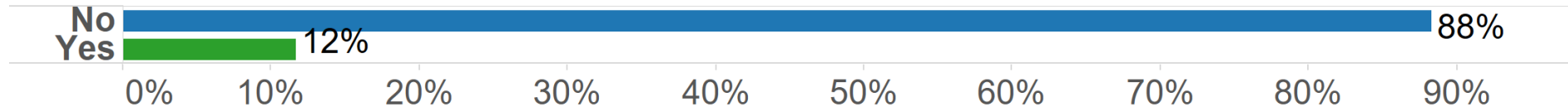
11) What is your political ideology?

Ideology



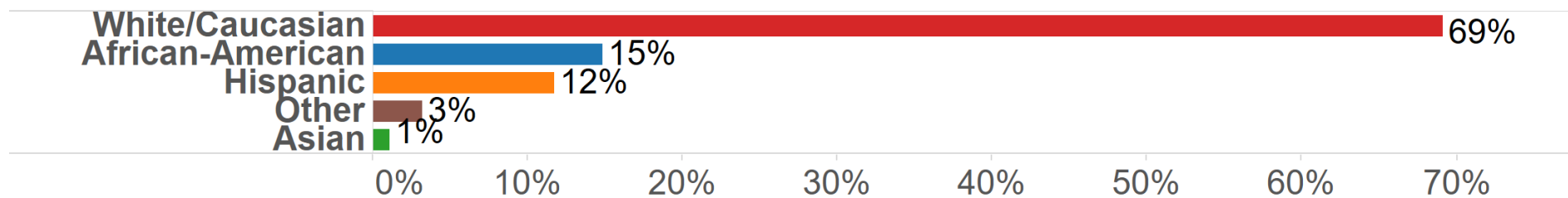
12) Are you or is a member of your immediate family from a Latino, Hispanic or Spanish speaking background?

Hispanic



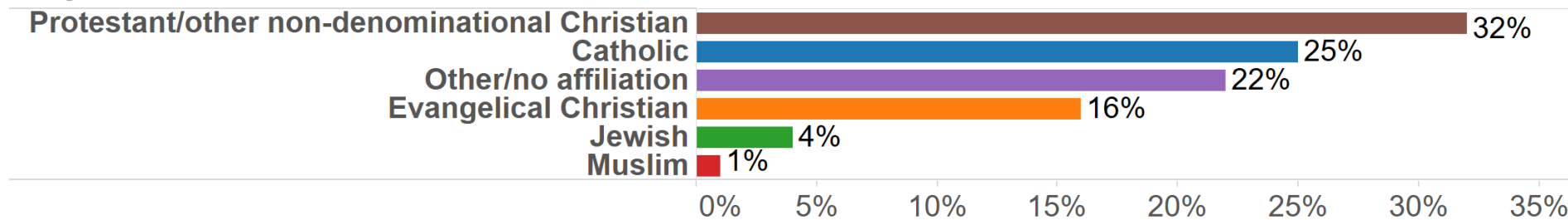
13) What race do you identify yourself as?

Race



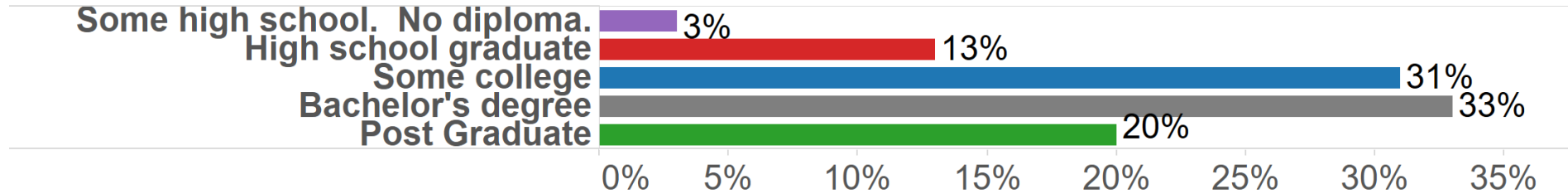
14) Which of the following best represents your religious affiliation?

Religious affiliation



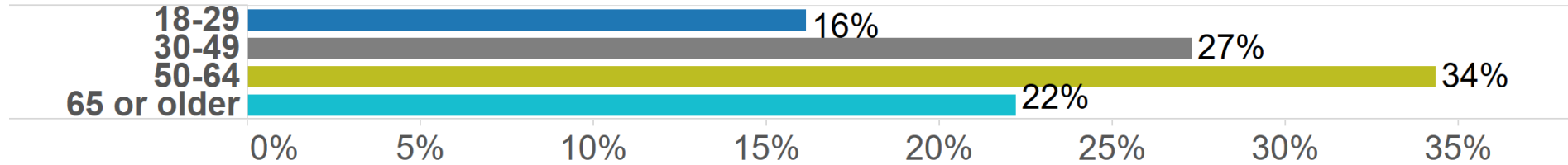
15) What is the highest level of education you have completed?
