2018 General Election

Survey conducted August 8 through August 9, 2018. 1,785 likely 2018 General Election voters participated in the survey.

Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2018 General Election. Margin of Error is +/-2.3%. Margins of Error within specific demographics (crosstabs) is significantly higher due to smaller sample size. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding. Survey conducted by TJP Strategies on behalf of Missouri Scout.
